Angella Michelle (Brown) Lambert of Hermiston, Oregon, was born December 2, 1960, in Portland, Oregon, to parents Phillip C. and Marianne Brown. She passed on July 28, 2015, at Kadlec Medical Center in Richland, Washington, after a short battle with cancer at the age of 54.

Angella was the second of three children and was raised in Hermiston and Umatilla, where she attended school, and finally ending in Albany, Oregon, and graduated at West Albany High School. After working in Albany for a short time,

Angella met and married her husband at the age of 19 and had three children, Tom, Dana and Joe. She was lucky enough to have seen much of the world in her travels around the world with her young family.

Angella eventually settled in Umatilla and raised her children there and was the owner/operator of the Rest-A-Bit Motel, where she was awarded twice the Business Woman of the Year award. She was very active in the community and strived to make Umatilla a better place to raise a family. She was very involved in the Umatilla Chamber of Commerce and was their past president, secretary and treasurer, and sat on the board of directors for many years. Angella was also passionate about the schooling system and was on the board of the Umatilla County Preschool and on the Umatilla School District Budget Committee.

After many years, Angella sold the Rest-A-Bit Motel and took a couple of years off to travel with her children. In 1998 Angella, along with her parents, purchased and managed the Desert River Inn Resort in Umatilla, which they managed until it was sold in 2013. She was active and very knowledgeable in the hospitality industry and very sought after for her expertise, and was recruited as the manager of the Best Western in Hermiston. She was a member of the Oregon

Lodging Association, Oregon Restaurant Association, Hermiston Chamber of Commerce, Boardman Chamber of Commerce, Umatilla Transient Lodging Tax Committee, Lions Club International and Eastern Oregon Trade & Event Center Building Committee.

Angella's greatest love was her children and spending time with them was important. She traveled to New Zealand whenever she could to spend time with her two eldest children who reside there. She had thousands of

friends and acquaintances, but her closest friend was Pam Lincoln of Hermiston, Ore., as they met at 8 years old and continued to be there for each other throughout their lives and spent many hours together.

Angella is survived by her children Thomas Lambert, Dana and Luc Ettema, all of Christchurch, New Zealand, and Joseph Lambert of Hermiston, Ore.; her parents Phillip C. and Marianne Brown of Hermiston; her siblings Mark and Jackie Brown of Nehalem, Ore., and Diana and John Woodward of Hermiston; her nieces and nephews Tammy and Nick Nearing of Hermiston, Jacob and Tiffany Brown of Nehalem, Ore., Mick Woodward and Janay Woodward, both of Hermiston, Ore., and many great-nieces and -nephews.

Margaret H. Haugeberg died on August 12, 2015, in her home in Hermiston, Oregon, at the age of 101 years. Margaret was born on January 20, 1914, in Decatur, Nebraska, to parents George and Eda Schmiedeskamp Rohde.

The family relocated to Portland, Oregon, in 1920 and settled in Rainier, Oregon, in 1922, where Margaret graduated from high school in 1932 and married the love of her life, Clinton "Clint" Edward Haugeberg, on October 10, 1936. Daughter Lynnea and son David were both born in Rainier before the family moved to Bend, Ore., in 1947. In 1983 Margaret and Clint moved to Hermiston to be near family.

Margaret led an active and interesting life. While in Rainier, she worked as a licensed beautician and then during WWII worked as an airplane spotter, reporting all planes flying along the Columbia River. While in Bend she was an active member of the Methodist Church and Eastern Star, volunteered with the American Tuberculosis Association, delivered surplus food for Deschutes County, provided care for a deaf-mute woman for 10 years and helped her parents. In Hermiston, she became active in the First Christian Church, Desert Bells Garden Club, RV Club and Travel Club. After husband Clint passed away in October 1988, Margaret stayed active in the church and became a founding member of the "Open Table" program where she continued to serve meals well past her 100th birthday. The last eight years of her life she lived at Sun Terrace

Assisted Living where she continued crocheting countless afghans for her family and friends, volunteering to paint the ladies' nails and played in the kitchen band. Faith in God, family, and service to humanity were the most important parts of her life.

She is survived by her children: Lynnea Sargent and husband Dick, Hermiston, Ore., and David Haugeberg and wife Cathy, McMinnville, Ore.; grandchildren Rhonda Winters (Dave), Mark Sargent (Gail), Dianne Shea (Brian) and Karen Timmons (John);
