Series of disturbances lead to arrests

HERMISTON — A string of reported disturbances Wednesday evening in Hermiston resulted in a warrant arrest and an underage alcohol citation.

Kylee Flores, 19, from Hermiston, was arrested on a Hermiston Municipal Court warrant and was booked and released. Joshua Hughes, 18, from Umatilla, was issued a citation for minor in possession of alcohol and released, according to information from Hermiston police chief Jason Edmiston. Several disturbances involving some of the same people were

reported at several locations throughout the evening, he said.

At about 7:30 p.m., officers were dispatched to the area of Northwest 11th Street and West Ridgeway Avenue for a report of a group of males preparing to fight. The officer’s report states the subjects left when they noticed they were being photographed.
