Free program covers allying for, updates to Medicare

Information about applying for Medicare and the latest updates to the program will be presented at free community meetings.

Presented by officials from Oregon's State Health Insurance Benefits Assistance program, Medicare 101: Are You Ready for Medicare? features 90-minute sessions, which include a question and answer period.

Other topics covered in the sessions include important deadlines to purchase additional insurance or prescription coverage, what happens if people continue to work after becoming Medicare eligible, how to compare Medicare supplements and how to evaluate long-term care insurance.

Cynthia Hylton, a SHIBA field officer, said many Oregon seniors have too much or inappropriate health insurance. Others don't get all their medical claims paid because they're overwhelmed by paperwork. SHIBA assists people in avoiding these pitfalls and enjoy all the benefits to which they're entitled.
