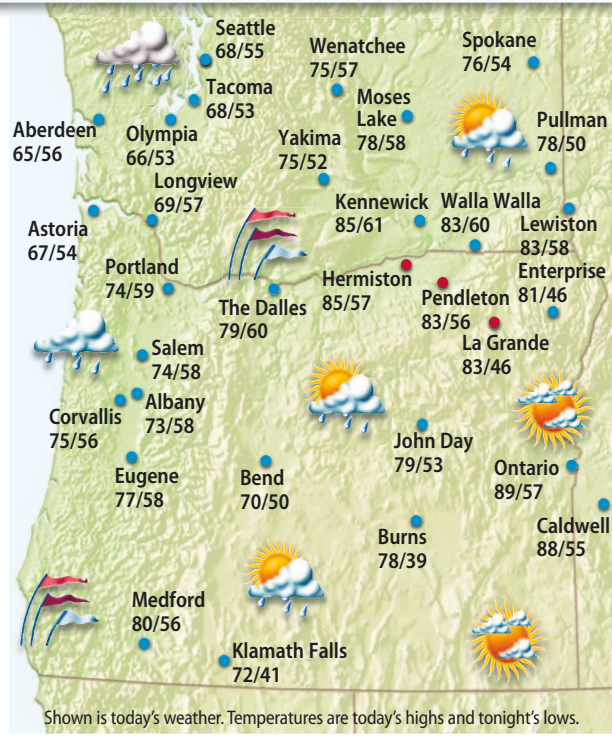

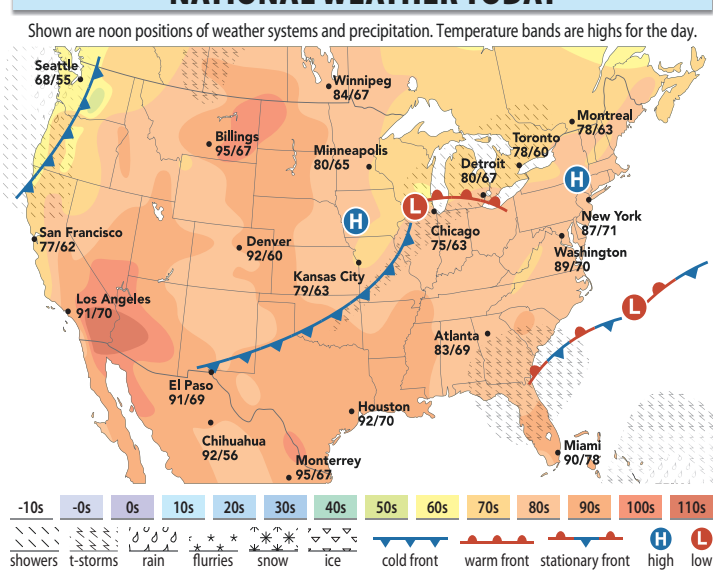

## Man who solicited child porn agrees to plea deal, gets 11 years

A Pendleton man who enticed four teen girls to send him pornographic pictures of themselves is going to prison for almost 12 years.

Jeffrey Spain, 31, of Pendleton pleaded guilty Friday at the Umatilla County Courthouse to four counts of attempted use of a child in a display of sexually explicit conduct in two cases, the second of which the state brought Friday as well. Circuit Judge Lynn Hampton sentenced Spain to a total of 11 years, eight months.

Spain's defense attorney, Herman Bylenga, explained it was all part of plea negotiations.

Jacklyn Jenkins, the district attorney's chief deputy prosecutor, said the first case involved a 17-year-old girl.

Court documents show the state accused Spain of convincing the teen to send pornographic images of

herself to him six times from Sept. 11 to Dec. 5, 2014. Pendleton police arrested and booked Spain into the Umatilla County Jail five days later, where he has remained. That case resulted in Spain facing six counts of making child pornography, five counts of luring a minor and one count of possessing child porn.

Spain pleaded guilty to a single lesser attempt charge, and Hampton sentenced him to five years, 10 months in prison, which also came from negotiations.

The second case involved three teen girls, Jenkins said, ages 16, 15 and 16, whom Spain contacted and lured to send him their photos from August to December 2013. He pleaded guilty to the three new attempt charges, and per the deal he received

another five years, 10 months to run consecutive to the first case. He also will live under post-prison supervision for three years. Spain can reduce his prison stay through good behavior, Hampton said, but he would register as a sex offender for life.

Hampton allowed Spain to write letters to his two daughters, 5 and 7. Bylenga said they are in the custody of their mother, who divorced Spain.

Spain did not make a statement to the court, and none of the four victims attended the hearing. Jenkins said she was in contact with those families, and they knew about the plea deal.

Jenkins also said Spain solicited two other teens in the scope of his crimes, and one was in court, but she did not want to give a statement.

Bylenga said he went through all of the state's evidence in the case, including messages over Facebook, and the sentence was a "just result."

#### Windy weekend will determine course of fire

ELGIN — How winds from a passing cold front affect the 74,421-acre Grizzly Bear Complex fire over the weekend will determine how fire responders approach digging lines to contain and combat it, and whether or not they will lower evacuation levels in the coming days.

Thirty-three structures have been lost to the fire 20 miles southeast of Dayton, Wash. It was sparked Aug. 13 by lightning in the area and is now 10 percent contained.

No changes in the current evacuation levels are planned until after frontal winds test fire lines Friday night and Saturday. Fire officials said they may consider reducing the levels Sunday if containment lines successfully hold the fire.

#### Air quality advisory lifted in Umatilla County

PENDLETON — Despite the fact that multiple fires continue to burn fiercely throughout the state, the Umatilla County Public Health department has lifted an air quality advisory for the county and surrounding regions — at least, for the time being. Clear conditions and increased visibility contributed to the department's decision to lift the advisory, according to a news release from the Umatilla County Public Health department.

"Experts noted that although smoke is not as thick as earlier in the week," said Meghan DeBolt, Umatilla County director of public health, "winds are expected to pick up tomorrow in Central Oregon, which may bring more smoke into Umatilla County."
