Mosquito spraying set for Tuesday in Hermiston

HERMISTON — Due to multiple samples that tested positive for West Nile virus, the West Umatilla Mosquito Control District plans to conduct targeted aerial mosquito control spraying with a twin engine airplane Tuesday after sunset.

The district now has 13 confirmed West Nile virus positive samples and is awaiting word on three more collected Thursday and sent to the Oregon State University Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory in Corvallis for confirmation, according to a news release from the control district.

Some 10,000 acres will be sprayed, including the Diagonal Road area between Edwards Road and the Highway 730 junction, and portions of the Loop Road area.

Residents in the target areas can expect to see low-flying airplanes spraying the insecticide Dibrom at a rate of 0.7 ounces per acre. The spray rate is 30 percent below the amount approved for safe application by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and would not have adverse effects to ornamental ponds or plant life, according to the release.

Dibrom is considered safe, with little to no risk of toxicity; but, the Public Health Department recommends pregnant women to reduce possible exposure.

Exhibit features Chinese artist, activist Ai Weiwei

WALLA WALLA — Contemporary Chinese artist and activist Ai Weiwei is featured in a gallery exhibition in Walla Walla.

The opening reception is Thursday, Sept. 3 from 5-7 p.m. at Foundry Vineyards, 1111 Abadie St., Walla Walla. The exhibit continues through Saturday, Oct. 31.

Weiwei is known internationally for his intellectually challenging artwork and criticism of the Chinese government. His passport, which was retained by the Chinese government in 2011, was finally returned in July.

The exhibit features the Rebar and Case series, eight sculptural works whose origin stems from the May 12, 2008 earthquake in Sichuan, China. More than 5,000 schoolchildren died during the disaster.

Foundry Vineyards also will exhibit the list of victims uncovered by the Citizens' Investigation, an effort coordinated by Weiwei to seek an explanation for the casualties. In addition, "Little Girls Cheeks," a film documenting the investigation, will play continuously throughout the exhibition.
