White supremacist gang member trial set for Nov.

The final core member of a white supremacist gang Pendleton police took down in January is headed to a November trial.

Warren Gerald Browning, 36, had a hearing Wednesday at the Umatilla County Court-house, Pendleton. Circuit Court Judge Christopher Brauer was good to his word from the last court action in the case, according to court records, setting the trial for Nov. 16-20.

The court also will hear motions in the case most of the day Nov. 4, before capping off with a trial read-

iness check. Motions are due Oct. 15.

Browning was a member of the United Aryan Empire, a gang police held responsible for firearms violations, assaults and murder plots. He has been in the Umatilla County Jail, Pendleton, since Jan. 19. The Umatilla County District Attorney's Office charged Browning with a slew of felonies, including racketeering and conspiracy to murder.

Pendleton Police Chief Stuart Roberts and District Attorney Dan Primus pegged Jeremiah Mauer, 31, as the

gang leader. He is serving a 13-year prison sentence after taking a plea bargain on July 2 and admitting guilt to conspiracy to commit murder and two counts of second-degree assault. That got him out from under the threat of the racketeering charge at trial, which could have resulted in a longer prison stay.

Fellow gang members Gregory Tinnell, 44, and Steven Gran-good, 22, also made plea deals and await sentencing, and member Matthew Reed, 24, is serving three years probation after pleading guilty to

attempted first-degree assault for trying to use a weapon to harm another man.

And the criminal trial for Joe Bonner, 46, of Pendleton, also is nearing. Court records show Brauer is overseeing that case as well and set the trial for Sept. 9. Bonner faces charges of first- and second-degree assault, possession of methamphetamine, menacing and second-degree disorderly conduct stemming from the Feb. 24 stabbing that sent a man to the hospital.

Bonner's co-defendant, Christopher Lyons, 43, pleaded no contest in April to third-degree assault. He is serving a 15-month prison sentence.

Mom accused of killing at hotel had seen psychologist

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — A mother accused of killing her 2-year-old daughter in a Cannon Beach hotel room last year had seen a psychologist about a month before the alleged crime.

Court records obtained by *The Oregonian* show Jessica Smith was evaluated in June 2014. The meetings were part of a custody evaluation as Smith and her estranged husband separated.

A Clatsop County judge has placed the documents related to Smith's visits under protective order, so the psychologist's conclusions are unavailable.

Smith has pleaded not guilty to murder in the July 31, 2014 drowning death of her younger daughter, and attempted murder in the slaying of her 13-year-old daughter. The surviving girl now lives with her father in Washington.

Smith's lawyers said in court earlier this year that she suffered a mental breakdown.

Gold Hill couple guilty of abusing 11-year-old boy

MEDFORD, Ore. (AP) — A Gold Hill couple accused of tying up an 11-year-old boy with rope and beating the child has been found guilty of assault and criminal mistreatment.

The Mail Tribune reports the boy's stepmother, 35-year-old Angela Marie Millard, and his biological father, 38-year-old Lawrence James Millard, were found guilty Thursday.

The boy, now 12, testified Wednesday that his stepmother burned his hands with hot water and hit him with a hairbrush. He said both his parents had tied him up with a rope, and his father beat him with a wooden table leg.

Prosecutors said Angela Millard hit the boy so hard with the hairbrush that she knocked his teeth out and left a scar near his eye.
