Spieth completes rare awards sweep

PONTE VEDRA BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Jordan Spieth was voted PGA Tour player of the year Friday, giving him a sweep of all the significant awards. The PGA Tour does not disclose how many votes

Spieth received from the players, though the 22-year-old Texan removed any suspense last week with his four-shot victory in the Tour Championship to win the Fed Ex Cup. Spieth had five wins this year, including the Masters and U.S. Open. He is the youngest player since Tiger Woods (21) to win the Jack Nicklaus Award as player of the year. Spieth also won the Arnold Palmer Award by topping the money list with a record \$12 million, and the Vardon Trophy for having the lowest adjusted scoring average. Since the FedEx Cup began in 2007, Woods is the only other player to sweep the awards, win a major and capture the FedEx Cup and its \$10 million bonus.

Appeals court calls for review of Solo assault case

SEATTLE (AP) — U.S. national team goalkeeper Hope Solo could again face assault charges stemming from an altercation last year with family members after a Washington state appeals court on Friday reversed a lower court's dismissal of the case.

The case stems from a dispute between Solo and her half-sister and 17-year-old nephew during a party in June 2014. Solo was charged with two misdemeanor counts of fourth-degree domestic violence assault. She pleaded not guilty. A municipal judge dismissed the case in January, but prosecutors — in a rare move — appealed that decision. The appeals court sent it back to the lower court on Friday.

Hermiston loses starting quarterback Neal to injury

Before Hermiston's non-league football game against Coeur d'Alene Friday night, it would've been a reasonable assumption that five Viking turnovers might have them driving back to the Idaho panhandle unhappy.

But the Coeur d'Alene defense that had allowed 17 points in its last three games held firm, and came out with a 43-10 win at Kennison Stadium.

"I definitely think we came together a little bit," senior defensive end Trey Neal said. "I think we looked a lot better on defense and offense despite

Tigers, Mustangs, Knights all win

STANFIELD — The Stanfield Tigers and Weston-McEwen TigerScots stood toe-to-toe in a Columbia Basin Conference slug-fest on Friday.

With both defenses delivering smash-mouth blows, the Tigers were able to deliver the knockout punch for a 19-14 win in each team's league opener.

The Tigers (4-0, 1-0) made a defensive stand on the TigerScots' final drive and then were able to run out the final 1:30 on a night that was lacking the gargantuan rushing totals each team had been putting up this season.

Weston-McEwen (3-2, 0-1) limited Stanfield running back Thyler Monkus to 78 yards on 17 carries, but quarterback Dylan Grogan was still able to run for 113 yards and two touchdowns



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on 12 carries. He attempted just five passes, going 1 for 5 for 14 yards.

Three more Stanfield rushers combined to add 93 yards, and Abraham Gomez added a touchdown.

"It was a tough defensive game, the yards were tough to come by tonight," said Stanfield coach Davy Salas. "There was lots of hard hitting and both teams were playing their hearts out."

Statistics for Weston-McEwen were not available.

Stanfield takes its unblemished record on the road to face undefeated Irrigon next week while Weston-McEwen hosts Pilot Rock.

HEPPNER 52, PILOT ROCK 19 — At Pilot Rock, Heppner's offensive line paved the way for another rout as the Mustangs ran out to a 46-0 half-time lead against the aggressive Rockets in each team's Columbia Basin Conference opener.

"Pilot Rock was bringing a lot of blitzes and so we kept it pretty simple and took what they gave us," said Heppner coach Greg Grant. "I thought the offensive line really got off the ball well."
