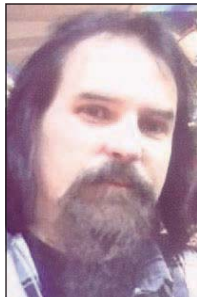
February 2, 1962-October 12, 2015
