### Stanford goes off to beat UCLA

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) — Francis Owusu's circus catch in the end zone on Kevin Hogan's third touchdown pass of the night highlighted a dominating performance for No. 15 Stanford, which rolled to its eighth straight win over No. 18 UCLA, 56-35 on Thursday night.



Christian McCaffrey ran for a school-record 243 yards and four touchdowns while gaining 369 all-purpose yards for the Cardinal (5-1, 4-0 Pac-12), who won their fifth straight in impressive and entertaining fashion against the Bruins (4-2, 1-2).

On a night full of big plays, none topped Owusu's 41-yard TD catch.

It started with McCaffrey taking a direct snap in the wildcat and handing to Bryce Love on a jet sweep. Love flipped the ball to Hogan, who threw deep to Owusu. Despite being interfered with, Owusu still managed to trap the ball against the defender's back and keep his hand on the ball to maintain control as the two fell to the ground in the end zone.

### Seahawks suspend fullback Coleman

BELLEVUE, Wash. (AP) — The Seattle Seahawks suspended Derrick Coleman on Thursday after police arrested him in a hit-and-run investigation, but his lawyer insisted that if the fullback left the scene at all it was only because he was dazed.

Coleman was booked into King County Jail in Seattle early Thursday and denied bail until his first court appearance, which was expected Friday afternoon. Bellevue officers said they arrested him because he left the scene of the two-car accident Wednesday evening.

Bellevue Police Chief Steve Mylett said finding out why Coleman left will be a focus of their investigation.

## Umatilla senior wins boys' title, Pendleton's Clem paces girls

Two hundred and forty-three runners took off down the first fairway at Wildhorse Resort and Casino Golf Course on Thursday at the start of the varsity boys' 5,000-meter cross country race at the annual Kyle Burnside Wildhorse Invite.

Not all of them were trying to keep pace with Umatilla senior Fabian Cardenas, but all that did failed.

Weston-McEwen's Hayden Scott and Pendleton's Nolan Bylenga took on the challenge and were the only two within striking distance as the race hit the quarter pole, but by the time the runners hit the halfway mark Cardenas had stretched his lead to 50 meters and continued to extend it with every stride.

He barely seemed winded as he crossed the finish line in 15 minutes, 54 seconds for a runaway win.

"I just treated this race like a workout," said Cardenas, who ran a personal best 15:31 at the Nike Portland XC on Sep. 26. "I try to just relax at the beginning, unlike last year where I would try to take it out right away. I was trying to push gradually as the race went on."

Scott, a junior at Weston-McEwen, eventually had to accept he wouldn't catch Cardenas.

"I know he's always going to be at least at 16 (minutes) or under, somewhere in there, so I just figured if I stay with

# Bucks start fast, can't hang on against The Dalles

Thursday's match between Pendleton and The Dalles began unlike many matches have this season for the Buckaroos.

Pendleton — usually a slow-starting team — came out of the gates with some fire, taking seven of the first 10 points from the Riverhawks. The Buckaroos kept the momentum on their side throughout the set to end up with the first set victory 25-18 over The Dalles.

However, the Buckaroos — a team that has struggled to finish off sets and matches — would not be able to hang on to that momentum as The Dalles overpowered the Bucks in the three subsequent sets to earn the 3-1 victory.

Thursday's game was tabbed

as 'Dig Pink Night' as part of the Buckaroos' 'Digging for a Cure' campaign for breast cancer awareness. Both teams sported pink jerseys to support the cause.

The game also marked the eighth-straight loss for Pendleton (4-11, 1-7), whose last win came against Centennial on Sept. 26.

But amidst the loss, Bucks coach Amanda Lapp was satisfied with the fight her team showed on Thursday.

"To hang in and make each set a tight set is always good," she said. "We worked hard tonight and that's what we've been searching for."

After dropping that first set, The Dalles (21-3, 7-1) rebounded in the second set taking a 4-3 lead early in the set, which was a lead they would not relinquish.
