

BUCKS: Nirschl, Greb lead team in kills

and looking for the entire season," she said. "To get a lead, keep the lead, and push through, so it was great to see the whole picture finally come together tonight."

The third set played out much like the second set, as the teams battled neck-and-neck all the way to a 22-22 tie. And then just like the second set, Hermiston gained the advantage and served game point a total of four times as Pendleton battled back before finally getting two straight to earn the 28-26 set win.

"It's one of our positive marks from the season is that they are a team that battles," said Hermiston coach Dorothy Smith. "I knew this was a young varsity team, but I've really seen them grow this year."

Hermiston got another big performance from junior Kynzee Padilla, who finished the night with nine kills and several key digs to keep the Bulldogs close.

The potential in Padilla as well as players such

as Hayden Meyers, Alex Barton, and Regan Meyers have Smith excited for what's to come next season.

"When they get it together, it's going to be there every single time," Smith said. "It's a great team, we're only losing one senior so that'll be easy to fill and keep the girls going at it."

In the fourth set, the match swung back into the Bucks favor as the team found the momentum early and breezed to a 25-16 set win to clinch the match victory.

"We've learned over the season that no matter what you have to continue to fight and bounce back," said Lapp. "And that's what we took into that (fourth) set, just forget about what happened and go for it."

The Buckaroos saw some big offensive nights from Nirschl and Greb as they led the team with 13 kills and 11 kills respectively — with many of those coming in the clutch.

Seniors Lauren Roberts and Yoshioka led the team defensively with a combined

50 digs. Freshman Aspen Garton was close behind with 20 digs.

"The seniors have been here and worked so hard for this," said Lapp. "And the new girls coming in and leaving their footprints already, they earned it tonight."

The teams played in front of a loud crowd at Warberg Court Monday, which included the loudest and largest student turnout for the Bucks this year.

For Yoshioka, that student support is something that will stick with her and be one of her best memories as a Pendleton student.

"There's really no feeling like it," she said with a smile. "To have a huge student body behind you just amps you up and gets you excited. I've been to a lot of schools (before Pendleton), but I've never seen one that's cheered so much and cared so much for the athletes."

And for Lapp, it was the best way to see the three seniors — Yoshioka, Roberts, and Shelby Greb — leave

their final mark.

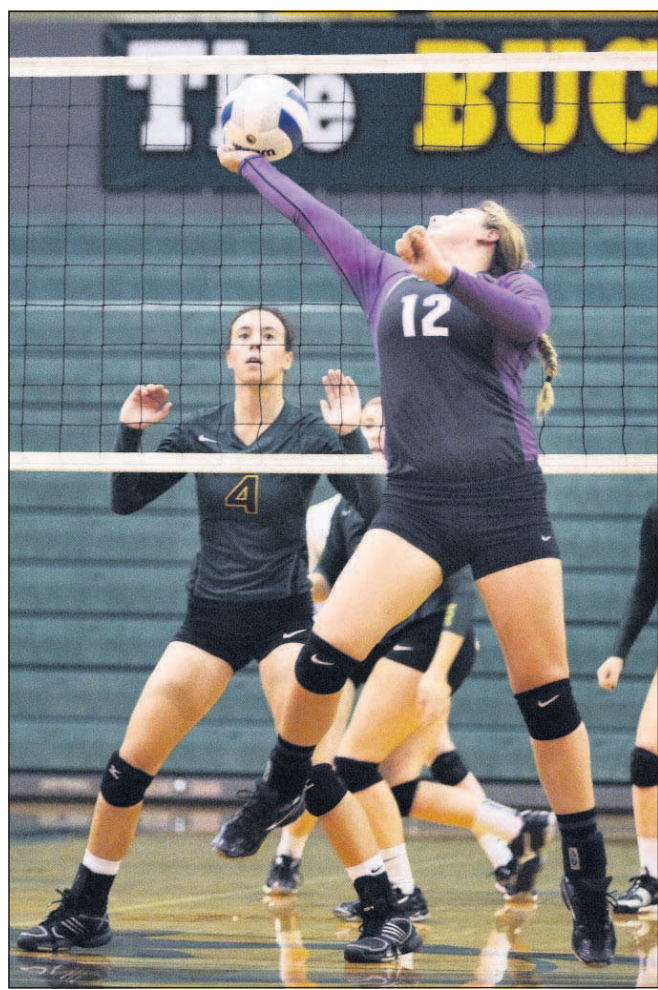
"I walked in here my first year and they were all freshmen," she said. "So to be here with them sitting on the bench and fighting hard through every point tonight and go out with the win over the rival, it's really heartwarming."

Pendleton now only has one game remaining on its schedule, which is a contest with Baker next Tuesday evening. The Buckaroos defeated Baker in their season-opener 3-0 back on Sept. 1.

But for Hermiston, it's the end of the road, finishing a disappointing first season under Smith and her coaching staff.

The Bulldogs lone Columbia River Conference win came earlier this month when they defeated Pendleton at home in five tough sets.

Sarah Finifrock led the TigerScots with 20 kills and 11 digs in the tournament, and Alyssa Finifrock turned in 18 kills.

Elsewhere, Ali Schroeder contributed 51 assists and six aces, while Sara von Borstel smacked eight kills and turned in 20 digs.

TigerScots finish the regular season on Tuesday when they host Stanfield at 5 p.m.

STANFIELD TIGERS — At Irrigon, the Tigers split at the

Irrigon Tournament, defeating Irrigon 3-1 and then getting swept by Culver 3-0.
