LA GRANDE — On Saturday afternoon, the Eastern Oregon Mountaineers were not able to hang onto a fourth quarter lead, as a blocked punt and subsequent touchdown return gave the Montana Western Bulldogs the 30-23 win to spoil EOU homecoming.

Eastern Oregon (2-5, 2-4) took a 23-22 lead when running back Jace Billingsley plunged into the end zone from one-yard out with 7:17 remaining in the fourth quarter.

But Montana Western grabbed the lead back — for good this time — when linebacker Dakota Wainwright blocked an EOU punt and returned it 36 yards for the touchdown.
