Elgin man gets three life sentences for child porn

LA GRANDE — A 62-year-old Elgin man will spend the rest of his life in prison after a judge found him guilty on child pornography charges.

Union County District Attorney Kelsie J. Davis McDaniel in a written statement said Roy Eugene Horn was an unyielding sexual predator and deserved the sentence.

Horn faced multiple counts of child pornography charges at a bench trial Sept. 30 and Oct. 1 in Union County Circuit Court, La Grande. Judge Brian C. Dretke found Horn guilty of 14 counts of first-degree encouraging child sexual abuse and two counts of second-degree encouraging child sexual abuse.

McDaniel noted Horn had previous convictions for child pornography and sexual abuse, as well as failing to register as a sex offender. Oregon law provides a third felony conviction for sex crimes warrants a sentence of life imprisonment without the possibility of release or parole.

McDaniel in a written statement said she argued that Horn's criminal history shows a pattern of "accessing and sharing child pornography while chatting online about his sexual interest in children" and Horn "repeatedly discussed his efforts to lure neighbor children throughout the years."

Horn "consistently preys on young children in his neighborhood," according to McDaniel.

The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children identified six children in Horn's pornography that law enforcement had rescued.

"These children were located within the United States and the United Kingdom and were all under the age of 11," according to the statement.

McDaniel called Horn "every parent's nightmare" and said there was no hope to rehabilitate him.

"The depravity of his predilections, his behavior and what we have seen over

the course of the years he has lived in Union County are just repeated victimization of kids across the world and right here in Union County," the district attorney said.

Horn in court blamed his court-ordered sex offender treatment classes for his behavior. A court first ordered the treatment in 1994 after a conviction of third-degree sexual abuse.

Courts ordered Horn into treatment again in 2004 and 2009.

"I feel like the victim here, I really do. I didn't hurt anybody," Horn told the judge, according to the statement.

Judge Dretke sentenced Horn to three consecutive true life sentences without the possibility of parole.

"The possession of child pornography is an offense that sheds light on the horrific market that exists for sexual exploitation of children," Dretke said. "And every image that I viewed is, to me, a reminder of

the abuse and molestation and sexual victimization of children."

The case stemmed from the Union County Sheriff's Office investigation into an unrelated incident. Sheriff's detective John Suttan interviewed Horn, and he admitted to accessing child pornography on his computer. Sheriff's Sgt. Bill Miller supervised the investigation, which included legal searches covering multiple mediums.

The evidence showed Horn accessed and duplicated child pornography on a variety of devices and technologies, including a laptop, desktop and flash drive.

"The sheriff's office conducted a relentlessly thorough search and eventually located the incriminating flash drive secreted inside three closed containers," the statement said.

The Oregon Department of Justice's Internet Crimes Against Children Taskforce conducted the forensic analysis in this case, linking the evidence to Horn and discovering hundreds of images of child pornography.

VFW seeks to honor additional WWII veterans

Senate proclamation commemorates service

World War II veterans attending a Veterans Day event at the Pendleton Convention Center received special proclamations with covers bearing the seal of the United States Senate. Now, Pendleton Let'er Buck Post 922 is seeking additional WWII veterans to honor.

The proclamation, made on the Senate floor, commemorated Umatilla County WWII veterans. The one-page document, read Oct. 29 by Sen. Ron Wyden, D-Oregon, says that Umatilla County lost 86 people during WWII, "but their spirit and stories live on through their families and communities."

Wyden also described other Umatilla County wartime contributions.

In 1941, he said, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers created an airport in Pendleton that became home to the U.S. Army Air Forces 17th Bombardment Group. The group defended the West Coast

from Japanese submarines after the attack on Pearl Harbor and participated in the first bombing of the Japanese homeland by the Doolittle Raiders. All 80 of Jimmy Doolittle's Raiders trained in Pendleton.

The proclamation also mentions the Umatilla Army Depot as a repository for munitions and supplies in underground silos.

"The depot created an economic boom for Hermiston — then a town of 800 — which ended up harboring 7,000 new workers," reads the proclamation. "The Umatilla County Depot became the largest munitions facility in the world and stayed active in Hermiston until 2001."

Pendleton Let'er Buck VFW Post 922 hopes to honor other WWII veterans with these proclamations.

"The VFW would like to honor all the World War II vets that we can contact and let them know we are thankful for their service," said Post Commander Tom Tangney.

He said the county's

contribution was huge.

"Of the 142 men from Umatilla County who have been killed in combat since the start of World War I, 86 were killed in the four years of World War II," Tangney said. "In the 1940s, the population of the county was much less than we have now."
