

# 2015: Coaching changes involved in two of Bucks' top three

Bulldogs remain relevant on the state level and build a strong foundation for the coming season.

4. Kennison hosts championships: The investment in top-of-the-line facilities continued to pay off in Hermiston as the OSAA again tapped Kennison Stadium as the site for three of the six championship football games.

Voted in a 2014 statewide poll as the best high school stadium in the state, Kennison is proving to be a boon to the local economy.

Economic studies showed events such as state championships are capable of infusing millions (\$4 million in 2014) of outside dollars into local coffers, and that's a big win any way you look at it.

5. Footballers reach new heights: The Hermiston boys soccer team finally caught a piece of postseason success in 2015 with the program's first playoff win.

The dream ended in the quarterfinals, however, with a 2-1 (4-3) loss on penalty kicks to Woodburn. Hermiston will return 15 players from its best-ever finish but loses three all-state performers to graduation.

## Pendleton's Top Five

1. Softball comes painfully close: Diamonds have been the Buckaroos' best friends in recent year and the softball team continued its reign as Pendleton's premier program in 2015 by qualifying for its fourth championship in five seasons.

The Bucks fell to 2-2 in those games, however, with a 3-2 loss to Putnam that saw the Kingsmen push the winning run across the plate on a sacrifice bunt in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Senior third baseman Darian Lindsay earned her third 5A Player of the Year award following the season.

This item appeared as part of the No. 1 moment in the regional list.

2. Baseball sends Whitten out strong: The Pendleton baseball team went on a postseason upset streak to send coach Greg Whitten out in style.

The 10-year skipper passed the reins following the team's state semifinal loss to eventual champion Hood River Valley, but not before the Buckaroos gave him one heck of a going-away gift.

The No. 14 Bucks pulled off upsets over No. 3 Corvallis, 10-3, and No. 6 Crescent Valley, 8-3, before running out of Cinderella

magic in a 1-0 eight-inning semifinal loss.

It was the fourth time in Whitten's tenure the Bucks had reached the final four.

3. Broadus rims out: The Pendleton boys basketball program seemed to be on the rise with the arrival of new head coach Brian Broadus in 2015.

The Bucks went 18-9 and won the Columbia River Conference title, then beat Corvallis 63-57 in a home playoff game to earn their first trip to the final bracket since 2010.

But 2015 turned out to be Broadus' only season with the Bucks after he accepted the head coaching job at Mountain View over the summer.

The timing of the move forced the Bucks to scramble to find a replacement, and settled quickly on former Southern Oregon standout Kyle Tedder.

The 23-year-old first-time head coach won his first game on the Pendleton sideline and the Bucks (4-5) headed into the new year on a two-game win streak.

4. Golfers match highest placing: A year after winning the program's first-ever state trophy, the Buckaroo girls golf team did it again in 2015.

Both times the team placed fourth in scoring with Haley Greb out in front. She improved her individual rank to third last season and was just seven strokes off the winning score. She birdied her final hole in a one-under par final round, and finished +3 for the 36-hole tournament.

Her older sister Shelby Greb was 10th and both are back to lead the squad again this spring.

5. Bylenga pushes record pace: Pendleton distance runner Nolan Bylenga didn't win the 800-meter final at the 5A Track and Field Championships, but he could definitely find a silver lining in his second-place finish.

Bylenga was less than a second off the record-breaking time of Bend's Caleb Hoffman, who set a new meet-best in 1:52.68. Bylenga's 1:53.49 was good enough to get him recruited by NCAA outdoor runner-up Florida heading into his senior season.

Bylenga and Hoffman were both juniors last season, setting up a much-anticipated rematch should both advance to the 800 finals this season.

sometimes you have to step away from it and stay confident and keep shooting. I think the second quarter reflected that."

Burke was 12 for 19 from the field, and Gordon Hayward had 23 points and 10 rebounds for his second double-double of the season. Rodney Hood finished with 18 points, seven rebounds and six assists.

Utah had dropped three of four, including a 94-80 loss at Minnesota on Wednesday night.

The Jazz grabbed control in the second quarter, outscoring the Blazers by 18 after the game was tied at 25 after one. Utah hit four 3-pointers during a 21-3 run.

"(Snyder) just told me if I miss a few shots, he still wants me to play the right way," Burke said. "But he wants me to still be aggressive. Don't get down on myself or get discouraged. In the past, sometimes I may have let that get to me."

"We played so bad last night I kept thinking in my head, tonight could be a total opposite for us as a team. It definitely was."

Portland's C.J. McCollum scored 32 points, including six 3-pointers.

Meyers Leonard had 17, and Allen Crabbe added 15.

The Blazers are 2-3 in their last five games.

"We shot 25 percent, we had eight turnovers and they made 3s," Blazers coach Terry Stotts said about the second quarter. "Some of them were contested. They had a horrible night shooting the ball last night in Minnesota. They came back and shot the ball well tonight. It's just one of those things."

Utah played without Derrick Favors, who has been hampered by back spasms and missed his fourth straight game. The banged-up Jazz also are missing Rudy Gobert (knee) and Alec Burks (lower leg) due to significant injuries.

Trail Blazers: Portland was held to 14 second-quarter points, the third-fewest it has scored in any quarter this season. ... McCollum has scored 20-plus points in nine of his last 12 games.

Jazz: Utah improved to 4-2 in the second game of back-to-backs. ... Elijah Millsap had seen an increase in court time due to injuries, but didn't enter until there was 2:03 left in the game.
