Gladys May (Lovgren) Alderman, a longtime resident of Heppner, Oregon, passed away peacefully at Heppner Memorial Hospital on the morning of December 19th, 2015. She was 96 years old.

Gladys was born to Frans (Frank) Martin and Hannah Marie (Erickson) Lovgren on May 16, 1919, at their farm located in Eightmile, Oregon, between Condon and Heppner. She was the seventh child and last surviving sibling of 13 brothers and sisters. She grew up in Eastern Oregon and helped raise her younger brothers and sisters after her parents had passed away.

Gladys married Archie Harlan Alderman (also a seventh sibling of 13) from Hillsville, Virginia, on August 26, 1939, in Heppner, Oregon. Gladys remained in the home after Archie's passing in 1995.

Gladys was a member of Hope Lutheran Church and a life-long supporter of the Elks Lodge and military veterans. She commissioned a commemorative poem in honor of the veterans, which is still located in the Veterans' Mini Park in Heppner. Gladys enjoyed arts and crafts and making ceramic items. She enjoyed spending time with her large family and was able to attend her final annual family reunion this summer. Gladys was truly a strong and determined "Pioneer Woman" who lived alone and continued to remain active and independent until her passing. She often mowed her own lawn into her early 90s and constantly met all of her life's challenges head-on. She volunteered and cared for anyone who needed extra

help. Except for the last few weeks of her life Gladys lived at her home with only modest help, and would have it no other way!

Gladys was preceded in death by her parents, Frank and Hannah Lovgren; her husband Archie Alderman; her daughter Dovie Louise (Alderman) Joy; her son-in-law Mike Joy; and her 12 sisters and brothers: Erma Christina (Lovgren) Keithley, Victor Arthur Lovgren, Helen Irene (Lovgren) Horton Stradley Nevis, Alfred Lawrence Lovgren, Edna Josephine

Donald L. "Don" Grauer of Hermiston, Oregon, was born on December 17, 1932, in Marcus, Iowa, to parents Leland and Lucille Dorr Grauer. He died on December 29, 2015, in La Grande, Oregon, at the age of 83 years.

Don was raised and attended school in Marcus, Iowa, and then worked on the family farm. He was united in marriage to Patricia L. Rembe on June 14, 1954, in Marcus, Iowa. Don served in the United States Army and was stationed at Fort Leonard, Missouri, until his honorable discharge.
