He was born on March 13, 1940, in Pocatello, Idaho, to parents James and Wilda Glass. James had immigrated to the United States from Scotland. Chuck was very proud of being a first-generation American and of his Scots heritage. His mother went to Prosser to care for her mother with Chuck and his sister Karen. His parents then divorced.

After his mother married Lee Wyckoff the family moved to Hermiston. Brother Bill and sister Mary Ann joined the family. Chuck enlisted in the U.S. Navy after high school. He was stationed at Midway Island and Stockton, California, as a storekeeper. He was honored to be a veteran. After his service he came back home to Hermiston and married Carol Dicken. Son Tim and daughter Lori were added to the family. Later the couple divorced.

He was employed with Union Pacific Railroad for 41 years in the Carman Department. He also was a cook on the Derailment Crew at Hinkle. For many years he was the Santa and rode in on a 1920s railroad motor car to Maxwell Siding Railroad Museum.

In 1975 Chuck married Trisha Schuening and daughter Marcey came with her to the marriage. Son Eric was born in 1976. Together the family enjoyed fishing and camping at Jubilee Lake. Chuck also enjoyed hunting with Eric and a group of friends out of Ukiah. He loved to cook when family and friends got together. The couple celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary this year.

Chuck was honored as Scouter of the Year in 2006 from Blue Mountain Council and Oregon Trail District. For about 30 years he volunteered with the Boy Scouts of America Troop 676. He also

volunteered in the Hermiston youth basketball and football programs with coaching. Some of his many activities included photography, Dutch oven cooking and participating in a mountain man club. He attended the Hermiston High football and basketball games for years as a fan.

He spent time with his veterans coffee group of friends Larry, Dennis and Bill. Rockey, his little dog, provided him with hours of companionship and laughter at his antics. He appreciated all that his friend

Darrell did in taking care of Rockey during his absence. He also enjoyed their friendship and time spent together.

He was a member of New Hope Church in Hermiston and especially enjoyed the fellowship at the community hymn sings. The family thanks everyone who prayed for Chuck and Trisha during his long struggle these past months.

Survivors include his wife Trisha Glass of Hermiston, Ore.; son Eric and daughter-in-law Jaimi Glass of Albany, Ore.; daughter Lori and son-in-law Chindo Rodriguez, and son Tim Glass, both of Hermiston; daughter by marriage Marcey and son-in-law Steve Wornell of Hermiston; brother Bill Wyckoff of Shelton, Wash.; sister Karen Schank of Shelton, Wash.; sister Mary Ann and brother-in-law Ken Marcuson of Republic, Wash.; seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Harlan P. Crawford, 87, of Ontario passed peacefully to heaven on Friday, January 1, 2016. He was at home with his family by his side.

Harlan was born on October 14, 1928. Harlan was the youngest of 8 children born to Wate and Mabel Crawford of Ione, Oregon. He was raised on a dryland wheat and cattle ranch that his mother and father homesteaded 12 miles north of Ione. His father farmed with teams of horses. As long as anyone can remember, Harlan was always farming. He attended and graduated from Ione High School in 1947. All of his life Harlan enjoyed sports, playing baseball on the city league as a teenager and on a semi-pro team in Pendleton, Oregon. He often worked the chain for high school football games.

Harlan married Ingrid Luise Hermann of Ione, Oregon on May 10, 1953. To that union five children were born. Harlan served in the Army, honorably discharged on May 20, 1955. He and his wife farmed in Morrow County, Union County, Harney County (including the Malheur wildlife refuge) and finally in Malheur County where they raised wheat, cattle and hay for 39 years. His family continues

the farming and ranching business. Extended Crawford family history is in the book Malheur Country

Historical Society Book Volume I. He loved the cattle he raised and was the happiest behind the wheel of a tractor or on the seat of a combine. He realized his lifelong dream — watching what Mother Nature made so pure and simple. He was a member of Pilgrim Lutheran Church, in Ontario, Oregon. He also served on the Annex School board for 8 years.

Harlan is preceded in death by brothers Vern Crawford, Arthur "Sam" Crawford and Rollo Crawford; sisters Margaret Morgan and Ruth Voorhees. He is survived by his sister Melba Miller (Pendleton) and brother Delmer Crawford (Hermiston), his wife Ingrid, daughter Tara (San Francisco), son Craig (Ontario), daughter Tammi (Caldwell), son Kyle (Nampa), and son Kevin (Spokane), five grandchildren and a great-granddaughter. We love him and will miss him until we meet again.

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to all for the prayers, help and professional and compassionate care given to him.
