CW-73: The Applicant proposes to conserve water by piping two miles and eliminating use of an add'l 1.5 miles of the Milton Ditch, moving the point of diversion 1.1 miles downstream, piping of a portion of the Powell Pleasantview Ditch, and installation of an automated headgate.
