Milton-Freewater man

arrested for mistreatment

MILTON-FREEWATER — A Milton-Freewater man was arrested Sunday, Jan. 16 for criminal mistreatment after officers found his disabled adult son bound to a reclining chair, covered in his own feces.

Milton-Freewater Police were called to a house at 113 N.E. Sixth St. on a report of a domestic disturbance. The participants in the disturbance had fled but police found Clifton Carson Jr., 29, tied to the chair in a "hidden, private room," according to police. Carson Jr. has cerebral palsy, cannot walk and is completely dependent on assistance from others for grooming and sustenance.

Carlson Jr. was taken to St. Mary Medical Center in Walla Walla for treatment of issues stemming from the condition he was found in.

His father, Clifton Carson Sr., 54, was interviewed by officers when he later returned to the house and was arrested for criminal mistreatment in the second degree and lodged in the Umatilla County Jail. He posted bail later in the week and is no longer in

Police arrest man accused of fleeing deadly crash

GRANTS PASS (AP) — Manslaughter charges have been filed against a Grants Pass man accused of

leaving the scene of a crash that killed his two passengers.

Oregon State Police Lt. Steve Mitchell says 43-year-old Gabriel Lovell was arrested Friday and booked into the Josephine County Jail.

The crash happened two weeks ago, when a Ford pickup sideswiped a parked tractor-trailer in Grants Pass.

Police say Lovell was behind the wheel of the Ford and ran from the scene. Emergency responders found his two passengers deceased: 36-year-old Jeremy Pearson of Ashland and 32-year-old Megan Becklund of Grants

Besides manslaughter, Lovell was charged with failing to perform the duties of a driver to injured persons.

Deputy claims retaliation by Klamath County sheriff

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — A deputy interviewed during a criminal investigation of the Klamath County sheriff says she intends to sue the county for retaliation and discrimination.

The *Herald & News* reports that Deputy Geneva Lewis and her attorney filed a tort letter in December saying she has grounds to sue for damages.

Lewis was hired as a deputy in 2012 and promoted to detective in 2014. She was re-assigned to patrol duty last year. She claims that Sheriff Frank Skrah

attempted to fire her multiple times over a work-related injury as retaliation for her involvement in the case. She says she was eventually forced on medical leave after Skrah misled human resources about her detective

Skrah has pleaded not guilty to assault, attempted assault. strangulation, harassment and official misconduct.

Lane Community College teacher files lawsuit against school

EUGENE (AP) — A tenured instructor at Lane Community College has accused the school of failing to address her concerns about a male student she says stalked her.

The Register-Guard reports that Nadia Raza filed a lawsuit Thursday in U.S. District Court in Eugene. She is accusing LCC officials of negligence, discrimination, retaliation and denying her equal protection.

LCC spokeswoman Joan Aschim declined to comment on pending

litigation.

In her suit, Raza says she went to administrators in 2014 after the male student turned in an assignment in which he wrote that he was affiliated with neo-Nazis. She said he then emailed her repeatedly asking her to meet off campus.

Raza says she felt threatened because she is a Pakistani-American Muslim woman. She says the school failed to protect her safety.
