Chamber Music Festival offers casual performances

Several small ensembles performing in a relaxed environment are featured during the Oregon East Symphony's Chamber Music Festival.

Symphony board members will serve hearty hors d'oeuvres and desserts during the event. In addition, ticket holders who are 21 and older will receive a complimentary beer or wine from The Prodigal Son Brewery & Pub during the performance.

The Chamber Music Festival is Saturday at 6:30 p.m. in the Vert Clubroom, 345 S.W. Fourth St., Pendleton. Tickets are \$20 for adults, \$15 for students and seniors or \$45 for a family. Tickets will be sold at the door. Also, tickets are available in advance at Armchair Books and the symphony office.

Among the performers are the Pendleton Brass Quartet, featuring Andy Cary (trumpet), Jill Scanlan (trumpet), Steve Muller (trombone) and Gary Ferguson (tuba). The group will perform a wide range of material, including Bach, New Orleans-style jazz and The Beatles. Formed in 1986 as The Bonneville Brass, the group has also performed as a quintet.

Also, symphony concertmaster Lisa Robertson will perform Johannes Brahms' "Piano Quartet in C Minor," with assistance from Lucia Orr (viola), Ed Dixon (cello) and James Cook (piano). And principal flutist Cathy Muller will perform Bohuslav Martin's "Trio for Flute, Cello and Piano," with A Sharps Conductor Bruce Walker (cello) and Emily Muller Callender (piano).

J.D. Kindle, the symphony's executive director, said the audience should enjoy the casual atmosphere of the

performances. Several intermissions between ensembles will allow audience members to enjoy food and drinks. In addition, Kindle said the intimate setting provides a different sort of concert experience than performances in larger venues.

"They'll be able to see the musicians up close," he said. "Seeing the intensity of them playing really enhances the listening experience."

The Chamber Music Festival, Kindle said, embraces the notion of the symphony being hosts

through the serving of food and beverages.

"It has a different atmosphere of our typical symphony concert," Kindle said. "We like to have fun."
