 Despite spending 20 percent of his high school career in the hospital, Mathew received a Citizenship Cup in 2008-09 and achieved an Honors Diploma, graduating with Highest Honors, Mu Theta Alpha National Honor Society and National Honor Society recognition.

He then attended Blue Mountain Community College, where he was quickly inducted into Beta Delta Zeta Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, with hopes of transferring to Oregon State University to earn a degree in electrical engineering and computer science. To earn his community service credit, he volunteered at the local women's shelter.

One of Mat's life goals was to create awareness about Cystic Fibrosis (CF). He did this openly online for all the world to see. Mat created an online community, which linked other CF'rs and loved ones from all over the world.

Mat genuinely cared for every person he encountered from every walk of life, in every venue. Because of CF, Mat was wise beyond his years and always willing to share life advice with

anyone who asked. His message for everyone was: "I want you to know that I am never leaving you. I will always be with you in your heart. Through good times and bad, think of me, and allow me to give you the courage and strength with anything you pursue in life. Go achieve your goals. Push the envelope. I will be watching over your journey every step of the way, forever, love you, Mat."

He precedes his mother, Marissa (Chad) Hascall; brother, Michael Ramm; and sisters, Caitlin and Chelsie Clough. Mathew also leaves behind one nephew, Elliott Hardcastle; and two cousins, Tyson Hascall and Austin Creger; grandmother, Brenda Hascall; great-grandmother, Shirley Brown; uncle, Thad (Tamlin) Brown; and aunt, Candice (Dane) Creger. He was preceded by grandfather, Henry Hascall; and great-grandfather, Leo Brown.
