Horton selected as USA Collegiate Team manager

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — Oregon coach George Horton has been named manager of the 2016 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.

USA Baseball also announced Thursday that Jason Gill, Mitch Karraker, David Pierce, Dave Serrano, and Dave Snow would serve as assistants.

Horton, an assistant on the 2012 Collegiate National Team, is entering his eighth season at Oregon. He's led the Ducks to NCAA regionals five of the last seven seasons. Horton previously coached Cal State Fullerton, winning the national championship in 2014.

The Collegiate National Team will train in Fullerton, California, and compete against teams in the California Collegiate League from June 28 to July 2. The team will follow with trips to Chinese Taipei, Japan and Cuba.

LeBron donates uniforms to Toronto schools

CLEVELAND (AP) — LeBron James crossed the Canadian border to dish out an All-Star assist.

The Cavaliers forward surprised school kids in

Toronto by giving them new team uniforms on Thursday, a giveaway sponsored by James' family foundation as a way of

thanking this year's host city for the NBA All-Star game.

The new uniforms for 23 teams from a variety of sports, including basketball, badminton, cricket, ultimate Frisbee, rugby and a special needs group, were unveiled during a fashion show at Earl Haig Secondary School. The teams from across the city were chosen by the LeBron James Family Foundation as a reward for sportsmanship and leadership.

Everyone was under 21 and 80 percent female."

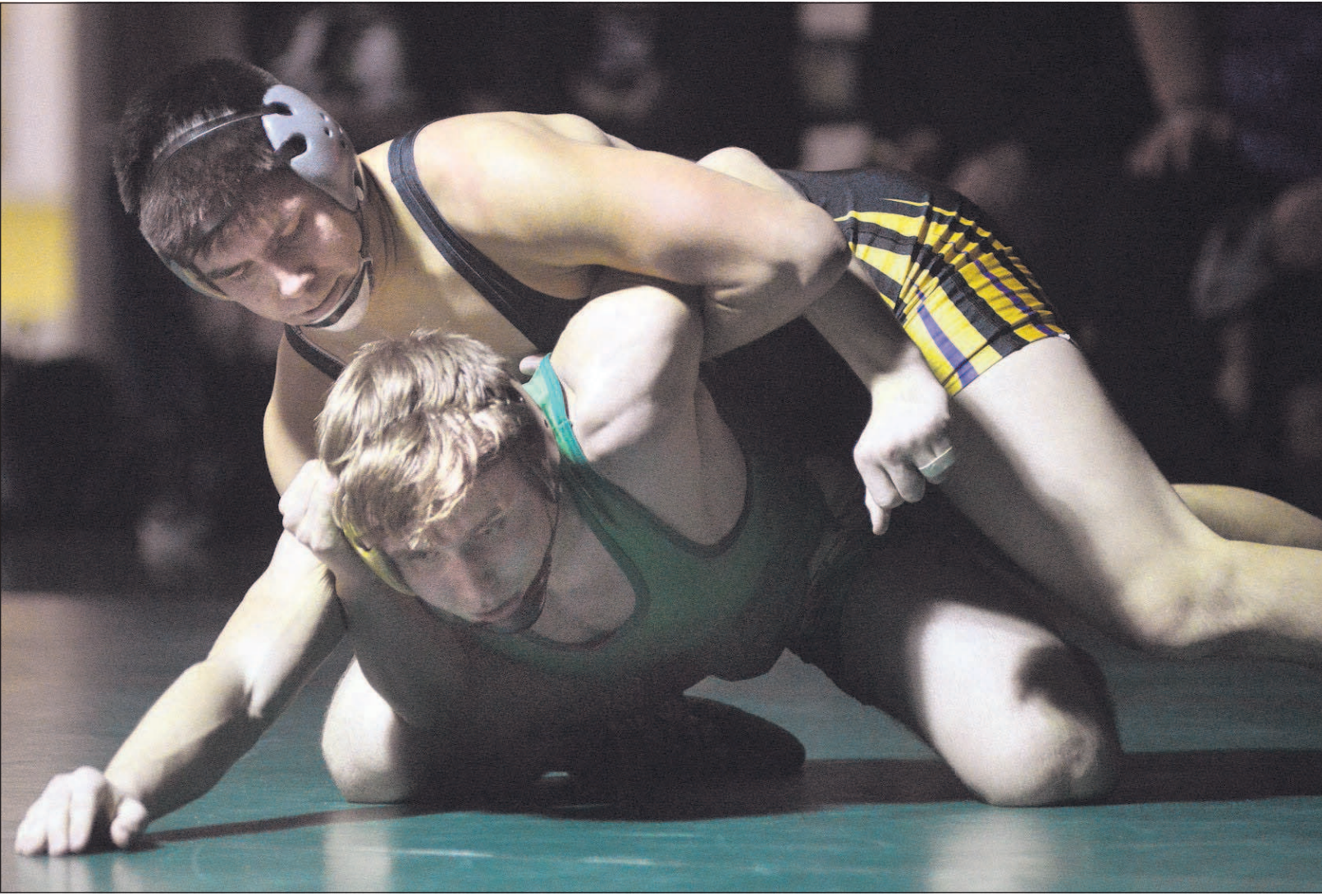

Oregon State earns rare win at Stanford

Tinkle nets team-high 19 points in win

STANFORD, Calif. — Tres Tinkle had 19 points and Oregon State never trailed in a 62-50 win at Stanford that gave the Beavers their first road victory in a Pac-12 conference game in more than a year.

Gary Payton added 14 points and Malcolm Duvivier had 11 for Oregon State (15-8, 6-6 Pac 12), which has won three straight.

Rosco Allen scored 12 points to lead Stanford (11-11, 4-7), which lost its fourth straight.

It was just the second win by



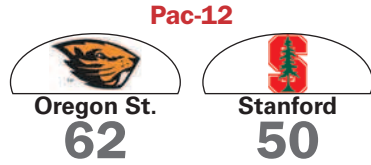
Oregon State guard Gary Payton II (1) is defended by Stanford guard Malcolm Allen (3) during Thursday's game in Stanford, Calif.

Oregon State at Stanford since 1993. The Beavers had lost 20 of their previous 21 games at Maples Pavilion, winning only in 2009. The victory was the first for the Beavers in a conference road game

since Jan. 17, 2015, snapping a streak of 10 straight road losses in Pac-12 play.

Oregon State opened the second half with an 11-4 run to build an 11-point lead, and

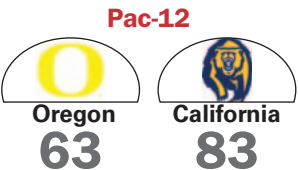


a 3-pointer by Payton with 8½ minutes remaining made it 47-35. The Cardinal made a late run, scoring six straight points to pull within 51-46 with three minutes left, but Payton responded with a layup and Stanford never got closer than five points the rest of the game.

The Beavers led 33-29 at halftime after shooting better from beyond the 3-point line (6 of 12) than from inside the arc (6 of 14) in the first half. Duvivier had three of those 3-pointers and Tinkle had two.

Ducks' win streak snapped in blowout by Cal

Golden Bears never trail in win versus No. 11 Oregon

BERKELEY, Calif. — Jabari Bird scored 16 of his season-high 24 points in the first half and punctuated his big night with a reverse dunk in the final seconds, leading California to an 83-63 victory over No. 11 Oregon on Thursday night.

The Golden Bears (16-8, 6-5 Pac-12) never trailed and led by as much as 25 while remaining unbeaten at Haas Pavilion this season.

It's Cal's third win over a ranked team this season and second in less than three weeks. Jaylen Brown added 16 points, Ivan Rabb had 13 points and seven rebounds, while Tyrone Wallace finished with 10 points in his return to the lineup after missing nearly a month.

Dillon Brooks scored 17 points, and Chris Boucher added 11 points and six rebounds for Oregon. The Ducks (20-5, 9-3) had their six-game winning streak snapped.

Cal lost to Oregon 68-65

when the two teams met in Eugene.

Bird got Cal off to a fast start with three quick 3-pointers early and repeatedly burned the Ducks from the perimeter. He finished with five 3s and the Bears had nine overall.

Oregon made one final push late and pulled within 72-57 with 4:51 remaining before Kameron Rooks scored on a tip-in to half the Ducks' surge. Brown followed with three consecutive baskets for Cal before Bird scored on a reverse dunk to cap the Bears' scoring and bring the sellout crowd of 10,628 to its feet.
