#### Two local police officers graduating from academy

SALEM — Two new local police officers are graduating Friday from Oregon's basic police class.

Anthony Martinez-Flores, 22, of Milton-Freewater, with the Milton-Freewater Police Department, and Jordan Robeson, 28, from the Roseburg area, with the Umatilla Police Department, are members of the Oregon Public Safety Academy's 354th basic police class. They are among 39 graduates that will work for police agencies throughout Oregon, according to a written statement from the Oregon Department of Public Safety Standards and Training.

The class is 16 weeks long and includes dozens of training areas, from survival skills to firearms to community policing. The 354th class graduates Friday at 11 a.m. at the Oregon Public Safety Academy, 4190 Aumsville Highway S.E., Salem.

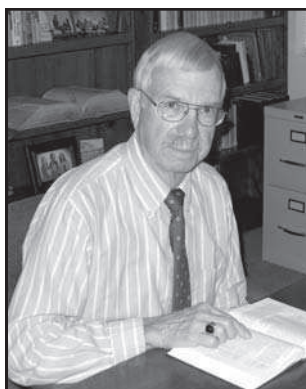
reports that 18-year-old Roscoe Lee Townsend pleaded guilty Wednesday to criminally negligent homicide and unlawful discharge of a weapon in the December shooting death of Dustin Lee Townsend Sr.

The teenager was sentenced to 12 years in prison, starting in the custody of the Oregon Youth Authority.

District Attorney Rob Patridge says the incident began when the elder Townsend got into a fight with a different son while traveling in a vehicle through Bly. During the fight, Roscoe Townsend shot his father twice with a bolt-action rifle.

Patridge says alcohol was a major factor.

The father had a lengthy arrest record, and Patridge says he hopes the younger Townsend can break the family cycle when he gets out of prison.
