including Gene's Electric, Pendleton Ready Mix, Best Little Computer, and Pendleton Music Store before it closed. He also repaired and tuned organs and pianos for numerous churches and private individuals on the side. In his free time Charles enjoyed playing his own musical instruments, taking walks or bike rides, and tinkering in his shop. Unfortunately his love of life and all things technical was cut short in 1999 when he was forced to early retirement due to progression of Parkinson's Disease.

Charles is preceded in death by his father Robert, mother Darlene, and younger brother Steven. He is survived by wife Jessica McEachern, younger sister Alice, children Sarah, Junella, Jonathan and Hannah, and eight grandkids, as well as stepchildren and their families.
