Karin Olsen Jackson passed away peacefully at Good Samaritan Hospital in Portland, Oregon, on Thursday, February 25, 2016. She recently had been hospitalized as a result of several medical issues. She was 62 years of age.

Karin is survived by her two sons, Rex Eric Rosenberg of Pendleton, Oregon, and KC Rosenberg of Gainesville, Georgia, KC’s wife Lucy Rosenberg, and three grandchildren, Griffin Rosenberg, Jacob Rosenberg, and Ethan Rosenberg, together with step-
