The Rotary Club of Pendleton is now taking applications for its Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA).

Each year, this competitive award allows the winner to attend a leadership training camp, during which they advance their skills in communication and conflict resolution and explore new ideas in interpersonal skills.

The leadership training is July 9-15, 2016, at Menucha Retreat Center near Corbett, located above the Columbia River Gorge between Portland and Cascade Locks. The week-long event is attended by about 40 participants and includes inspiring presentations and seminars by top professionals in various fields.

Applicants for the Rotary Youth Leadership Award must be 19 to 28 years old on July 9, 2016, and should be interested in expanding and displaying their leadership qualities. Those who are already employed in a leadership position in a local business or in college are particularly encouraged to apply. Employers are encouraged to provide vacation time for the awardee or to pay their wages while the employee is absent. The Rotary Club of Pendleton pays the full tuition expense for the training, but the winner is asked to arrange his or her own transportation. After the July training, RYLA attendees are asked to visit their sponsoring Rotary club within several weeks to share their experiences.

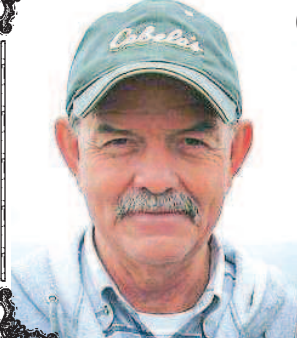
