**Filmmaker cruises into Eastern Oregon**

Documentary recreates 3,200-mile road trip

A documentary film based on the re-creation of a 3,200-mile road trip by four Seattle women provides a visual time capsule that explores how the landscape, architecture and culture of the Pacific Northwest has changed over the years. "The Great Northwest," a 90-minute experimental documentary by Portland filmmaker Matt McCormick, follows the route the gals — all single and in their late 30s — made in 1958.

The women piled into a '55 Plymouth and journeyed across Washington, Idaho, Montana and Oregon. They documented their trip in an elaborate scrapbook, which included photos, postcards, brochures, napkins, receipts, beverage labels, parking permits and handwritten notes. McCormick found the scrapbook 50 years later in a thrift store.

McCormick is taking a road trip of his own to share the film in six Eastern Oregon cities, including Hermiston and Pendleton. He will be on hand to introduce the film Tuesday, March 22 at 6 p.m. at the Hermiston Public Library, 235 E. Gladys Ave.; and Saturday, March 26 at

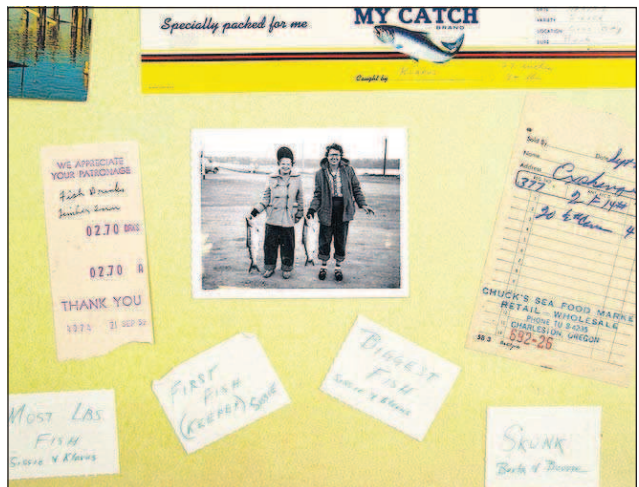

3 p.m. in the Vert Club Room, 345 S.W. Fourth St., Pendleton. A question and answer session will follow each screening. The programs are free and open to all ages.

McCormick, owner of Rodeo Film Company, has received numerous awards for his projects. In addition to films, he has directed several music videos.

"The Great Northwest" premiered at the 2112 International Film Festival Rotterdam. Also, an art installation version of the film is part of the permanent collection at the Tacoma Art Museum in Tacoma, Washington.

The program is sponsored by the Libraries of Eastern Oregon through

the National Endowments for the Arts' ArtPlace America. The Libraries of Eastern Oregon is a nonprofit organization that provides art-based programming at libraries in 15 rural counties. It supports workshops, presentations and art exhibits.
