She was well known for training and breaking horses in the Pendleton and Hermiston areas. Emma met Jack Roberts when his brother went to borrow money from Dad to take Mom out. Dad rode up on a horse, and Mom thought, "My tall handsome cowboy," until he stepped off the horse. She married Jack W. Roberts on July 10, 1958, in Waitsburg, Washington. They lived in Adams, Oregon, until 1961 when they moved to Echo, Oregon, where she has lived since. Emma worked at the Pendleton Woolen Mills for 25 years, never missing a day of work. The last 10 years of

Jack's life he drove her to and from work. It did not matter the age, all loved spending time on the well-known front porch. You could always find Emma drinking a cold one and visiting with her family and friends. She enjoyed puzzles and gardening.

She is survived by her children: Kenny and Debbie Roberts, Jerry and Marie Roberts, Tracie and Jake Broyles, Sunnie and Bill Wright, and Alvin Roberts; friends and neighbors Sheryl Morris and son Justin Morris, who Emma thought of as a grandson; sister Ruth Mead; 20 grandchildren; and twin great-grandchildren.

Iris Dykstra Christiansen passed away on March 14, 2016, in Redmond, Oregon.

Iris was born to Phebe and Edward Dykstra in Clem, Oregon, on May 14, 1928. In 1942, following her father's death, she and her mother moved to Pendleton where she graduated from Pendleton High School in June 1946.

Iris married Melvin R. Christiansen, her high school sweetheart, on June 26, 1948. They lived in Tillamook, Joseph and Elgin, Oregon, prior to settling down in Pendleton in May of 1964 where Mel was working as a heavy equipment operator.

In Elgin she was very active in the First Christian Church. After returning to Pendleton, a period of time passed before she began attending the First Christian Church in Pendleton. She then became very active in her service as a deacon, in the Women's Fellowship Group and played hand bells for 10 years.

Upon returning to Pendleton, she was involved in Home Extension and served as an officer in the Home Extension Advisory Committee. Through the Home Extension group, several women from their home group started a craft group that met every week. They would do plastic canvas, crochet and/or knit.

In 1983, she started working at a laundry mat pressing clothes. Following this job, she worked for the Pendleton School District as

a playground aid at Washington grade school before transferring to Hawthorne school as an aide in the resource room. She retired from there at age 62.

In November of 2013, she moved to live with her son Merlyn in Redmond, Oregon.

In September 2015, she moved to Country Canyon Adult Care Home until her death on March 14, 2016.

Surviving members of her family are: Merlyn (Lana) Christiansen of Redmond and Carol (Dave) Fitzsimmons of Pendleton; grandchildren Kevin (Lisa) and Kip (Rachelle) Christiansen, Melvin Fitzsimmons, Roberta (Christopher) Smith, Sandi Trowbridge, Shari (Steve) Oswald and Chris (Gretchen) Hancock. There are 22 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren.

Iris was preceded in death by her husband Melvin; son Steven; granddaughter Karen; her parents, three sisters, one brother, and numerous nieces and nephews.
