Bill Glennie was born near Klondike in Sherman County on 9-6-1924, raised in Eastern Oregon, and graduated from The Dalles High School. He and Susan were married in September 1943. Bill served in the U.S. Army during WWII, from April 1943 until he was honorably discharged in December 1945. He received the Bronze Service Star for the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign and the Good Conduct Medal.

He was a faithful parishioner of St. Mary's Catholic Church and his children attended St. Joseph's Academy in their primary grades of education.

Following Susan's death he lived alone until his health declined in 2015.

Interment will be arranged at a Veteran's Administration Cemetery near Portland, where his remains will be placed at rest with his wife's. No services are scheduled at this time.
