Jim was born November 19, 1920, in Conrad, Montana, to Leo and Teresa Walter Stewart. He attended schools in the Great Falls, Montana, area, graduating in 1939. He was a radio operator as part of a bombardier unit that flew missions over the western tip of England, and he celebrated the end of World War II in Paris, drinking champagne from the high-heeled shoe of a French woman.

After the war, Jim worked for the U.S. Forest Service for several years. On March 30, 1953, he married Naomi Hess in Hood River, Oregon. Together, they operated

"Stewart's Variety Store," first in Ordnance, Oregon, and later in Spokane, Washington. In 1962 he began his career with J.C. Penney Company. During his 20-year career, he worked at stores in Lewiston and Sandpoint, Idaho, Pasco, and Kennewick, Washington, and in 1970, he and Naomi moved their family to Pendleton, where he completed his career with Penney's, retiring in 1982.

After retirement, Jim and Naomi spent many years traveling; some of their favorite destinations were Alaska, Hawaii, Australia, Mexico and the Panama Canal. Jim was an avid fisherman and enjoyed the years that they lived on the Salmon River at Otis, near the Oregon coast. They returned to Pendleton in 1999, and after Naomi's death in 2004, Jim remained a resident of Sunridge Retirement Community until shortly before his death.

Jim was preceded in death by his wife Naomi, his sister Antoinette, and his young son George. He is survived by daughter Kathy Rinehart and husband James, son Tim and his wife Colleen, and son Thomas, all of Pendleton, and his son Dennis and his wife Lori of Gig Harbor, Washington.
