He is survived by his children, Antonio Jimenez III, Xavier Jimenez and

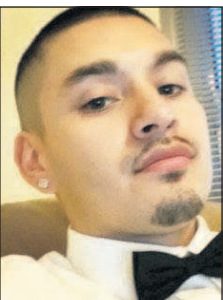

Leonard Bruce ‘Klop’ Klopfenstein

Leonard Bruce Klopfenstein (Klop) was born November 25, 1929, in Aberdeen, South Dakota, and passed away peacefully in his home in Pendleton, Oregon, on March 12, 2016, with loved ones at his side.

Leonard was the youngest child of Peter and Florence Klopfenstein, having three brothers, Ralph (deceased), Wayne (Seattle, Wash.), and Bob (Seattle, Wash.). Upon graduating from Aberdeen Central High School in 1948, his patriotism and love for his country led him to enlist in the Marine Corps during the Korean Conflict. It was during this time that he was given his life-long nickname “Klop.”

Klop began his aviation career as a fueler for an air mechanic in Rapid City, South Dakota. Soon, he was the guy that climbed up on the roof of the hanger, and by hand-set, gave the clear to all incoming and outgoing aircraft. He worked for Western Airlines and later became an air traffic controller at Oakland International. He retired in aviation data processing at Salt Lake City International. During those years he made a lot of friends, many of which became life-long, and considered these relationships special and of great value to him.

Klop stayed active all his life. He did his morning

exercises without fail, enjoyed his home and gardening, wood working and playing with his “flight simulator.”

Also, he was an avid Utah Jazz fan. He loved solving problems, whether they were mechanical, technical or personal. His methodical approach to all left very few unresolved. Klop considered himself quite the handy-man and would boast about being a “Jack of All Trades,” but first and foremost, he

was a family man. It was a rare occasion for him to miss a weekend BBQ, family reunion or wedding, often times being called upon to be videographer of the event.

Klop was preceded in death by his son Michael Klopfenstein, and is survived by sons Monte Beckman (Pendleton, Ore.), Murray Beckman (Portland, Ore.), and Nick White (Salt Lake City, Utah); daughter Jaime Layden (Sandy, Utah); grandchildren Jared, Dale, Levi, Isaac, Walker, Joshua, Megan, Jade and Dylan; and a host of great-and great-great-grandkids as well.

Klop requested to be laid to rest at the Black Hills National Cemetery in Sturgis, South Dakota, where he will receive full military honors.
