Kindergarten registration begins next week

Kindergarten registration begins next week for many Eastern Oregon school districts. To be eligible for kindergarten in the fall, students must be 5 years old by Sept. 1, 2016 (born on or before Sept. 1, 2011) for most districts, but parents with students close to that cutoff should contact the specific school for more information. Enrollment forms may be picked up in advance at some schools or downloaded from the school's website, and registration requires the student's birth record (birth certificate, baptismal certificate or passport), Social Security number, proof of residence and health/immunization records.
