NCAA bans satellite football camps

(AP) — The NCAA announced Friday that it was barring football coaches from holding camps or clinics on other campuses.



In banning the so-called satellite camps, the NCAA said the Division I Council had approved a proposal requiring Bowl Subdivision schools “to conduct camps and clinics at their school’s facilities or at facilities regularly used for practice or competition.”

“Additionally, FBS coaches and non-coaching staff members with responsibilities specific to football may be employed only at their school’s camps or clinics,” the NCAA said. The change was effective immediately.

Rockies rookie continues historic home run streak

DENVER (AP) —Trevor Story became the first major leaguer to homer in each of his first four games, connecting two more times for the Colorado Rockies in a 13-6 loss to the San Diego Padres on Friday.

Story now has six home runs since making his debut on opening day with two shots off Zack Greinke.

2013 — Freshman Breanna Stewart scores 23 points and Connecticut wins its eighth national championship with a record 93-60 rout of Louisville. It’s the most lopsided victory in a championship game.
