ARRESTS, CITATIONS

Pistols purchased for parole and probation officers

Umatilla County parole and probation officers will now use Glock 19 pistols.

County Community Justice Department director Dale Primmer asked the county board of commissioners on Wednesday to authorize spending \$5,592 to buy 12 of the guns, plus holsters and magazine holders for the 9-mm ammunition. The board voted 3-0 in favor.

Primmer said this was a lingering issue since the department separated years ago from the sheriff's office. Probation officers are peace officers under Oregon law, he said, and carrying a gun is typical for the job.

The sheriff's office policy allowed those officers to carry their own guns, a policy Community Justice continued.

"The result is we have a hodgepodge of equipment and a number of different firearms out there on any

given day," Primmer said. The department is then contractually obligated to provide training and ammunition for each gun in use.

Providing guns and limiting the model used on the job will save money on training and ammunition.

Choosing the Glock 19 makes sense, Primmer said, because it is the same gun local law enforcement uses, and probation officers Pat McGraw and Joel Edmonds are Glock instructors.

The department has two probation supervisors and 14 officers in two teams, one for the east side of the county and one for the west.

The department is buying the guns from Keith's Sporting Goods, Gresham, an authorized law enforcement dealer that Primmer said gets the guns directly from the maker.

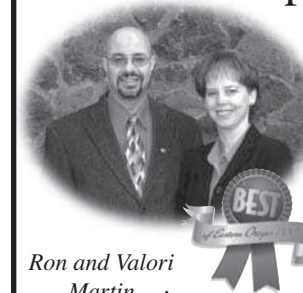
