# HERMISTON UCSO arrests two for vehicle theft

Two men were arrested Tuesday for vehicle theft and drug crimes near Hermiston, though one of the men claims they thought the truck was already stolen and they were just borrowing it to get to the store.

The case started at 12:45 p.m. on Monday when a resident of East Theater Lane reported an abandoned white Isuzu flatbed pickup near her house. She had noticed the vehicle the night before and contacted law enforcement when it was still on the side of the road Monday afternoon. Another area resident also reported the vehicle and said the turn signal was on at 3:30 a.m.

Law enforcement investigated and discovered the vehicle was reported as stolen from Ione and also was suspected of being involved in a pursuit with the Hermiston Police Department in the early morning hours.

Law enforcement notified the owner of the vehicle

because the ignition was "punched" — broken so the vehicle could be started with a screwdriver — and they needed assistance from a locksmith to retrieve it. While the owner was making these arrangements, at about 5:30 a.m. Tuesday, the Theater Lane resident called again and reported that two men were driving away in the pickup. The owner confirmed that it was not him, and he had not permitted anyone to drive the vehicle.

Umatilla County Sheriff's Deputy Nathan Good spotted the vehicle near Northeast Eighth Street and stopped it nearby, and arrested occupants Ronald Paul Johnson, 55, and Shane Verhey Springer, 27. The two

men, listed as transients by the sheriff's office, were taken into custody and both men admitted to having methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia in their possession. Johnson, who has an extensive criminal history, also had an outstanding warrant for a parole violation.

Springer told officers he and Johnson were together when they saw the vehicle and noticed that the ignition was "punched." He said they believed it was already stolen, so they decided to borrow it to go to the store.

Johnson and Springer were lodged at the Umatilla County Jail. Springer has been charged with unauthorized use of a vehicle and possession of a stolen vehicle. Johnson was charged with a parole violation, failure to pay fines, unauthorized use of a vehicle and possession of a stolen vehicle.

The case will be forwarded to the Umatilla County District Attorney's Office.

### City to consider BMCC baseball field lease

PENDLETON — Pendleton City Council will consider a five-year contract that will allow Blue Mountain Community College to continue to use baseball fields that are now on city property.

The fields had been Blue Mountain Recover Center property. The city recently became owners of that land, as well as land that used to house the Eastern Oregon Training Center.

According to the contract, BMCC will not pay for the property, but will insure and maintain it.

The council also will consider awarding a three-year, \$30,000 contract to Goldstreet Design Agency to design, print and mail the Environmental Protection Agency-mandated annual Water Quality Report.

The only other significant agenda item is a six-month extension of the moratorium on building cell towers while the Pendleton Planning Commission spends more time creating permanent regulations.

# Pilot Rock native aims to take on garbage business

Pilot Rock is on the verge of having a new garbage collection business.

Pilot Rock native Jimmy Doherty offered to buy Pilot Rock Sanitation and rename it Eastern Oregon Waste Management. The city council last month approved transferring the sanitation franchise to the new company, and Umatilla County Board of Commissioners on Wednesday approved Doherty's application for a new franchise.

The county board also renewed solid waste franchises for three other garbage businesses: Desert Wind, Inc., Hermiston; Humbert Refuse and Recycling Inc., Milton-Freewater; and Pendleton Sanitary Service Inc., Pendleton.

Before Doherty can start operating May 1, he will have to show proof of having liability insurance, which he said he is confident he will obtain.

Susan McHenry chairs the county's Solid Waste Committee. She told the board there has not been a new waste service franchise in the county for years, and even had to dig through old files to find the paperwork required to do so. The waste committee on April 5 approved it with the insurance caveat.

Doherty said he plans not to change collection rates for a year and keep both of Pilot Rock Sanitation's employees.

Jimmy is the son of Pilot Rock City Councilman Raymond Doherty. He said he worked in his father's two businesses, Doherty Fence and then RDF

Troughs, an aluminum tank manufacturing operation. The younger Doherty said he managed the latter for more than two years before taking a job with Union Pacific.

While the railroad pays better, Jimmy Doherty said it was not what he wanted.

"I just kind of missed the small business end of things," he said.

Jimmy told commissioners the transition will be simple.

"I just plan on stepping in and taking over daily operations," he said. "That's pretty much it."
