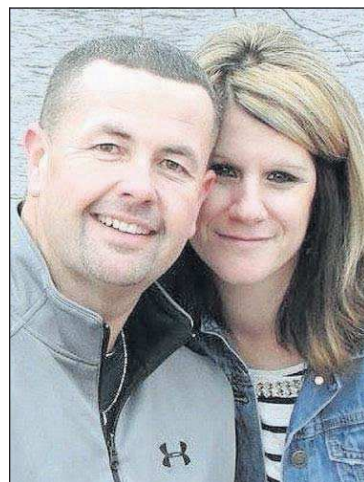
**Groups celebrate National Service Day**
