100 Years Ago

April 30-May 1, 1916

Word has been received here that through the efforts of Congressman Sinnott a conference committee passing on the Indian bill has decided in favor of the original plan for erecting two bridges on the Umatilla reservation, one at Mission and one at Thorn Hollow. As adopted by the conference committee the federal government will provide two thirds the bridge cost and the county one third. As amended in the senate by Senator Lane the bill provided that the county pay half and the government half. The news is welcomed here as it gives promise of the early construction of the two bridges, both being badly needed. The appropriation, however, has not yet been passed by congress.

50 Years Ago

April 30-May 1, 1966

State Rep. Stafford Hansell, R-Hermiston, Friday said it is time for Oregon to accept a sales tax. In what he called "a

change in my thinking," Hansell said his proposal would levy a sales tax of three to four percent on all "end products," including food. Feed, seed and fertilizer would be exempted to avoid double taxation. Oregon can't have property tax relief and new state programs, too, he told an area conference of the Oregon Corrections Association here.

25 Years Ago

April 30-May 1, 1991

Jim Kindle threw a five inning no-hitter and his Heppner Mustang teammates pounded out 14 hits as they ran away from the Weston-McEwen TigerScots 17-0 Tuesday. The Mustangs took sole control of second place in Columbia Basin Conference high school baseball standings, while the TigerScots dropped out of a second-place tie with Heppner. Kindel, a left-handed fastballer, struck out 11 and walked four in the no-hitter. "He threw a super ballgame," Weston-McEwen coach Duane Meek said. "Most of his Ks were one ball, two strikes, so that tells you he was just in total command."

On April 30, 1789, George Washington took the oath of office in New York as the first president of the United States.

On this date:

In 1803, the United States purchased the Louisiana Territory from France for 60 million francs, the equivalent of about \$15 million.

In 1812, Louisiana became the 18th state of the Union.

In 1900, engineer John Luther "Casey" Jones of the Illinois Central Railroad died in a train wreck near Vaughan, Mississippi, after staying at the controls in a successful effort to save the passengers.

In 1939, the New York World's Fair officially opened with a ceremony that included an address by President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

In 1945, as Soviet troops approached his Berlin bunker, Adolf Hitler committed suicide along with his wife of one day, Eva Braun.

In 1956, former Vice President Alben W. Barkley, 78, collapsed and died while delivering a speech at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia.

In 1958, the American Association of Retired Persons (later simply AARP) was founded in Washington, D.C., by Dr. Ethel Percy

Andrus.

In 1968, New York City police forcibly removed student demonstrators occupying five buildings at Columbia University.

In 1973, President Richard Nixon announced the resignations of top aides H.R. Haldeman and John Ehrlichman, Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst and White House counsel John Dean, who was actually fired.

In 1975, the Vietnam War ended as the South Vietnamese capital of Saigon fell to Communist forces.
