Together, they built a family of three children, Kathy, Philip Jr. and Johnny, as well as five grandchildren, Natalie, Michael, Yamina, Alisha and Taliyah. Philip and Pacita recently celebrated 54 wonderful years of marriage.

After his career in the military (Army and Air Force) he worked as a security specialist for the U.S. Treasury Department and later became captain of the U.S. Mint in San Francisco. He was also put in charge of disaster preparedness for the mint. For over 20 years, he commuted from Napa Valley to the city and crossed the Golden Gate Bridge over 12,000 times.

Philip loved to serve the community by working as a reserve police officer for the San Bruno and St. Helena police departments.
