There, the Summit Storm clinched the district championship with 38 points ahead of Mountain View in second with 16.5 points and Hermiston in third with 10.5 points.

Hermiston still had singles player Jacob Snell and doubles pair Race Latham and Cameron Meade alive for day two, but both ended up with fourth place finishes with defeats in the semifinals. Snell fell to Summit's Cole Younger in three sets, winning the first set 6-3 before falling 7-6 and 6-3. Latham and Meade fell to the Bend duo of Aaron Banquer-Glenn and Nicolas Campbell in two sets 6-4 and 6-2.

Summit's Carter Quigley, the bracket's No. 1 seed, won the singles title, and Summit's Andy Jones and Dylan Warren won the doubles title.

The three Hermiston players will now prepare for the 5A state tournament, which will kick off on Thursday at the Portland Tennis Center.
