**Canines take a bite out of cancer**

Man's best friend joins the fight against cancer this weekend during Bark for Life, a Relay for Life event for the American Cancer Society.

In its sixth year, the event highlights the benefit dogs provide to cancer patients and survivors, said organizer Jennifer Pittam.

"Dogs love you unconditionally," she said. "They don't care if you are losing your hair or don't feel good. They can make a lot of difference in people's lives."

Pittam, who has been active with Relay for Life for 15 years, helped organize the first Bark for Life event in Hermiston after researching events that could include people's dogs.

"People love walking their dogs. Unfortunately we'd have to ask them to take their dogs home because they weren't allowed on the fairgrounds," Pittam said about Hermiston's Relay for Life.

Pittam said Bark for Life has quadrupled in size since the first year. The past couple of years, the event has been held at the same time as Hermiston's Own Saturday Market. The shared space, Pittam said, has been beneficial in raising awareness and support for Bark for Life.

A 5K fun run and dog walk kicks off the day. Registration, which costs \$15, begins Saturday at 7 a.m. at McKenzie Park, 320 S. First St., Hermiston. The walk starts at 8 a.m. Awards will be presented at 9:30 a.m. The Bark for Life opening ceremonies begins at 10 a.m. The cost is \$20 with dogs or

\$10 for people without dogs. Also, special event T-shirts will be available for \$14.

The event, which runs until 1 p.m., includes a silent auction, games, music, a doggie wash, free nail trims, a photo booth, dog agility demonstrations, training tips, information about the Canine Good Citizen test and a hot dog barbecue. Prizes will be handed out for contests, including biggest dog, smallest dog, best dressed and pet-owner lookalike.

Also, be sure to stop by the Ask a Vet booth. Local veterinarians will answer pet-related questions. Also, Fuzz Ball Animal Rescue will bring some animals that are available for adoption, Pittam said.
