Tigers smooth out rough start, beat Honkers

Stanfield advances to 3A quarterfinals

STANFIELD — The Stanfield Tigers overcame a rocky start to their postseason to cruise past Lakeview 11-2 on Wednesday in the first round of the OSAA 3A baseball state tournament.

Brody Woods pitched into the seventh inning, and Jason Fitzpatrick and Adrian Renner each had three hits to lead the Tigers into the quarterfinals for the second-straight season.

Woods finished with two runs allowed, but neither of them earned, off four hits, two walks and three hits batters over 6 1-3 innings. He struck out seven.

Tony Flores relieved him in the seventh, and struck out the final two batters.


The No. 3 Tigers (26-2) committed two of their four errors to allow the No. 14 Honkers (20-8) to take a 1-0 lead in the first inning, but responded with four runs in their at-bat.

Thyler Monkus walked to lead off and Flores followed with a single. Dylan Grogan then singled and Lakeview made an error trying to field the ball to bring Monkus and Flores around for a 2-1


Lakeview didn't score again until the seventh.

Fitzpatrick went 3 for 3 with three RBI to lead the offense, Renner was 3 for 4 with three runs and one RBI, and Flores went 2 for 4 with two runs.




