STANFIELD — The first time through the lineup, the Stanfield Tigers had a little trouble figuring out Catlin Gabel starting pitcher Patrick Muskat in Friday's 3A baseball quarterfinals.

The second time was a different story.

Stanfield nearly batted around twice during a deciding third inning and went on to win 17-1 in their final game of the season at Madigan Field.

Fifteen Tigers came to the plate during the third. Seven



Irrigon reaches first semifinals with win over Kennedy


