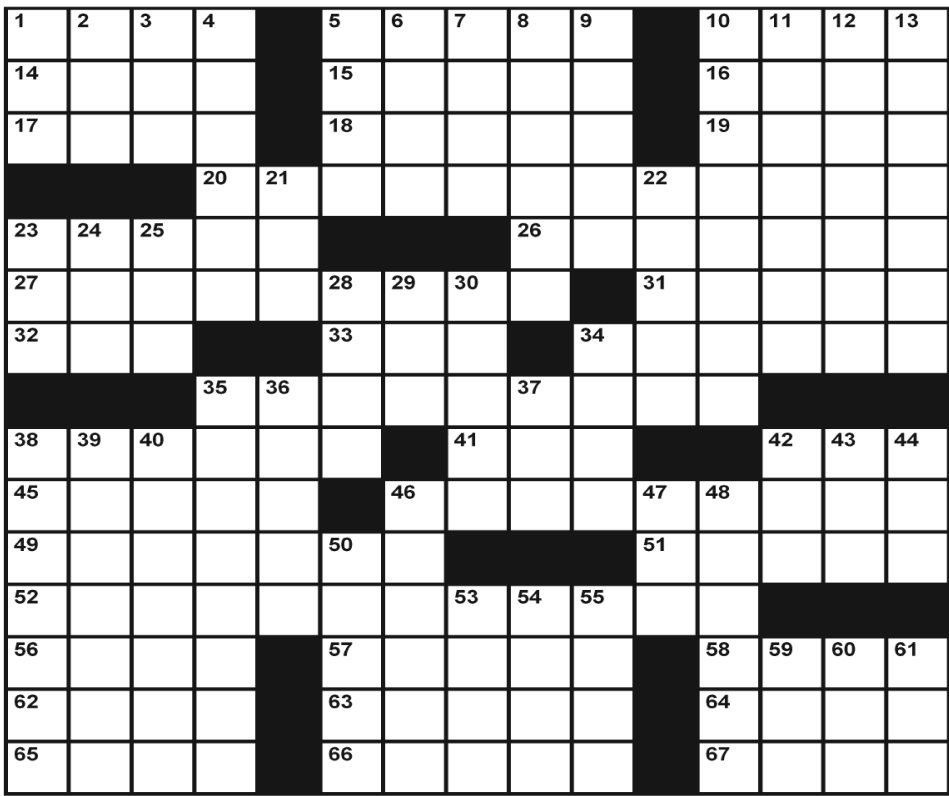

Dear Bullied: Yes, I do. This may not be bullying in the physical sense, but losing a friend can be painful.

It is important that you realize that people aren't inanimate objects that can be "owned" or "stolen." Much as we might wish it, relationships do not always stay the same. Friendships can be stronger at times and weaker at others, and people sometimes drift from one close friendship to another.

When this happens, regard it as an OPPORTUNITY, because that's what it is. It's a chance for you to get involved in activities that will expose you to new people and offer you a way to make NEW friends.

100 Years Ago

A lively runaway occurred Friday in Ukiah when Hugh Lenz's big team became frightened while he was fixing fence on his farm and bolted straight for town, coming in on a back street. In making the turn around I.R. Lawrence's store the wagon struck the porch, leaving the hind wheels of the wagon, and when the team reached Main Street it ran into the Fred Peterson yard where it collided with the fence posts, tearing them down and striking the porch, tearing out the cornerpost and mashing a wheel of the wagon. There a horse fell and they were caught without further damage.

50 Years Ago

Pendleton High's track and field entries in the state A-1 meet at Corvallis had mixed success Friday in the preliminaries but one of the successes was outstanding. According to a telephone call from Coach Grant Schiewe last evening, Jim Gorman, second in the state 880 last year, won the fastest heat Friday in 1:55.4, a school record for Pendleton. It was seven-tenths of a second faster than the 1:56.1

set by Dick Hall of Pendleton at Corvallis in 1964. Gorman also is qualified for the mile, which will be run in its entirety today with no preliminaries. Schiewe said he was leaving it up to Gorman whether he would skip the mile and concentrate on winning the 880, or attempt them both.

The new Umatilla Welcome Center and the remodeled James H. Sturgis Bridge will be dedicated together in a public ceremony Saturday, June 1. At 1 p.m. the Welcome Center will be dedicated by Julie Curtis of Salem, acting director of the state Tourism Division; Mike Thorne, the former state senator from Pendleton who now directs the Port of Portland; Chuck Norris, state representative from Hermiston; Gordon Bell, interim director of the Washington Tourism Division, and Karen Miller, president of the Tri-Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau. At 1:30 p.m. the Sturgis Bridge will be dedicated by J.X. Wilson of La Grande, the top-ranking supervisor in the state Highway Division's Region 5. The Sturgis family will be represented by granddaughter Melinda Matlock Tetherow of Rancho Palos Verdes, Calif.

Today's Highlight in History:

On May 28, 1934, the Dionne quintuplets — Annette, Cecile, Emilie, Marie and Yvonne — were born to Elzire Dionne at the family farm in Ontario, Canada.

On this date:
In 1533, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Cranmer, declared the marriage of England's King Henry VIII to Anne Boleyn valid.

In 1892, the Sierra Club was organized in San Francisco.

In 1912, the Senate Commerce Committee issued its report on the Titanic disaster that cited a "state of absolute unpreparedness," improperly tested safety equipment and an "indifference to danger" as some of the causes of an "unnecessary tragedy."

In 1929, the first all-color talking picture, "On with the Show!" produced by Warner Bros., opened in New York.

In 1937, President Franklin D. Roosevelt pushed a button in Washington signaling that vehicular traffic could begin crossing the just-opened Golden Gate Bridge in California. Neville Chamberlain became prime minister of Britain.

In 1940, during World War II, the Belgian army surrendered to invading German forces.

In 1959, the U.S. Army

launched Able, a rhesus monkey, and Baker, a squirrel monkey, aboard a Jupiter missile for a suborbital flight that both primates survived.

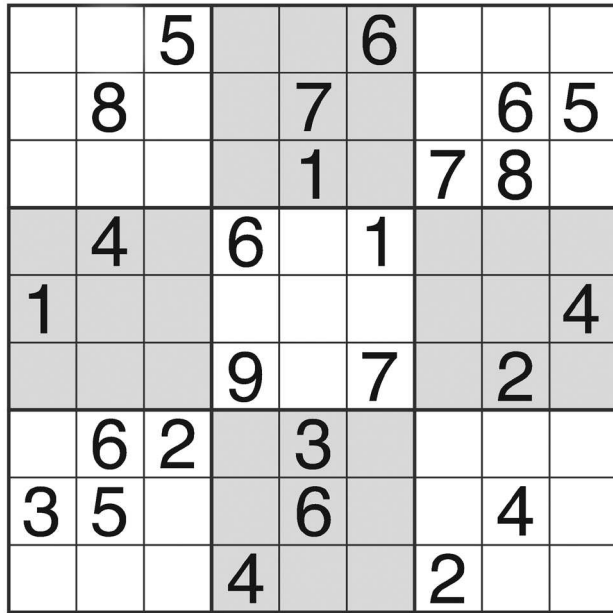

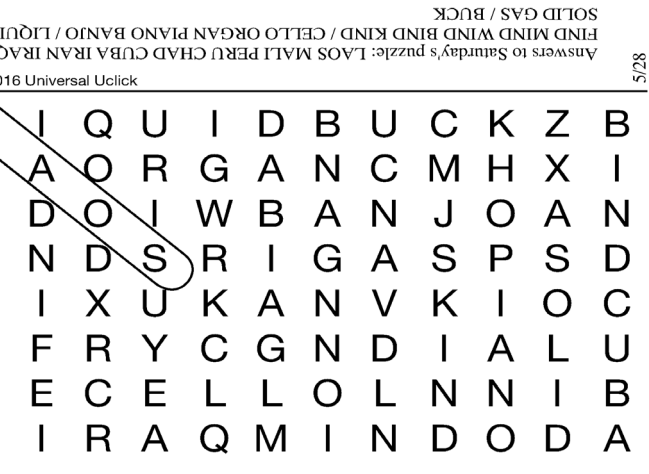
