DAYS GONE BY

100 Years Ago From the East Oregonian June 11-12, 1916

Because he put up a strong fight against arrest, J.W. Stevenson was this morning given a heavy sentence by Acting Recorder John Hailey. Not only was he fined \$25 but he was given a ten day jail sentence. Thoroughly intoxicated by alcohol, he was picked up Saturday night by Officer Scheer, whom he fought all the way to the station. There he continued the fight and had to be clubbed by Officers Scheer and Nash before he would submit. The acting recorder happened to be present at the time and needed no other evidence.

50 Years Ago From the East Oregonian June 11-12, 1966

Capt. Bill Carpenter, Pendleton native, said today he called in air and artillery strikes on Communist troops overrunning his position in Vietnam because "this was the most effective way I could see to kill them." The

decision saved the ground for his company on Thursday and may win him the Medal of Honor. His company is Company C of the 502nd Battalion of the "Screaming Eagles" 101st Airborne Division. Carpenter, 28, who won fame as the "Lonesome End" of the 1959 West Point football team, marched the remains of his company out of the battle area today.

25 Years Ago From the East Oregonian June 11-12, 1991

A 17-year-old Milton-Freewater girl was in stable condition today at St. Mary Medical Center after being rescued from the Walla Walla River Tuesday. Stephanie Holt was swimming in the river when she was swept downstream into log. She was trapped with her head above water until a passing motorist pulled her to shore, police said. Holt was swimming near the Ninth Street Bridge when the accident occurred, according to Milton-Freewater ambulance reports.
