Four children later, they moved to Seattle in 1961 where they had their last two children, raising all six children in the Seattle area until 1973, when they moved to Pendleton, Oregon. She tirelessly worked on a book that was published in 2003 about her deaf-blind son, titled "The Road To Autonomy." She lived a life of helping people and, as a registered nurse, worked at hospi-

Jean took great satisfaction in being able to bring communion to confined and ill parishioners unable to attend Mass until her own illness. Some of her fondest work memories were at Wesley Homes in Des Moines, where she touched many lives and developed lifelong friendships.

Jean was preceded in death by her husband Floro, and is survived by her children Jeanette (Joe), Cyndi, Gerry (Kathy), Larry (Gina), Eva and Eugene. She is survived by her sister Donna, 14 grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren and many loving nieces and nephews. We will all greatly miss her.

A rosary prayer service will be held Thursday, June 23, 2016, at 7:00 p.m. in the chapel at Bonney-Watson Memorial in Sea Tac.
