Safe Communities refines its focus

Changes are coming to the Healthy Communities Coalition's Safe Communities committee.

Safe Communities started with funding from the Oregon Department of Transportation and continued to provide traffic-related safety programs for six years.

Many restrictions have been placed on the ODOT grant on the federal level. For example, the committee can no longer purchase car seats or helmets for distribution.

The decision also was made to restructure Safe Commu-

nities and broaden the areas of focus, including domestic violence and child abuse, teen violence, bullying, cyber-bullying, cyber safety, gun safety, homelessness, fire safety, traffic-related safety and water safety.

Anyone interested in participating in activities related to these focus areas are encouraged to attend a Safe Communities meeting, held every second Wednesday of the month at noon at the Good Shepherd Medical Center conference room 2, 610 N.W. 11th St., Hermiston.
