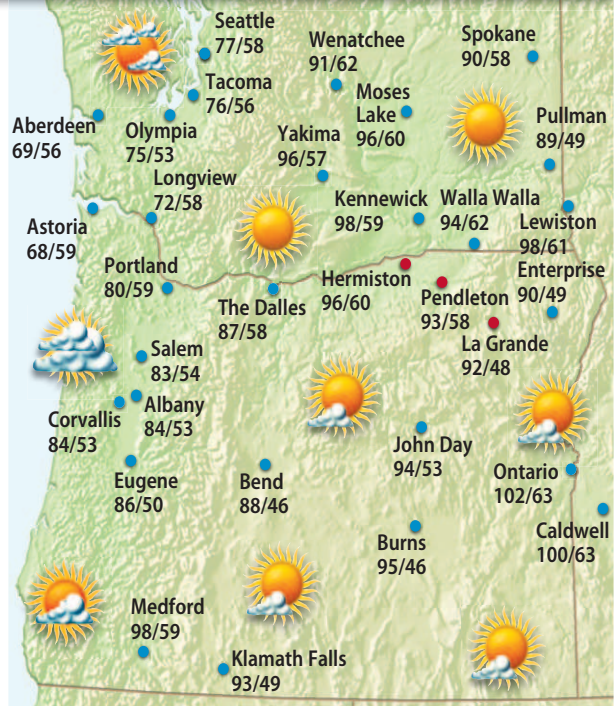

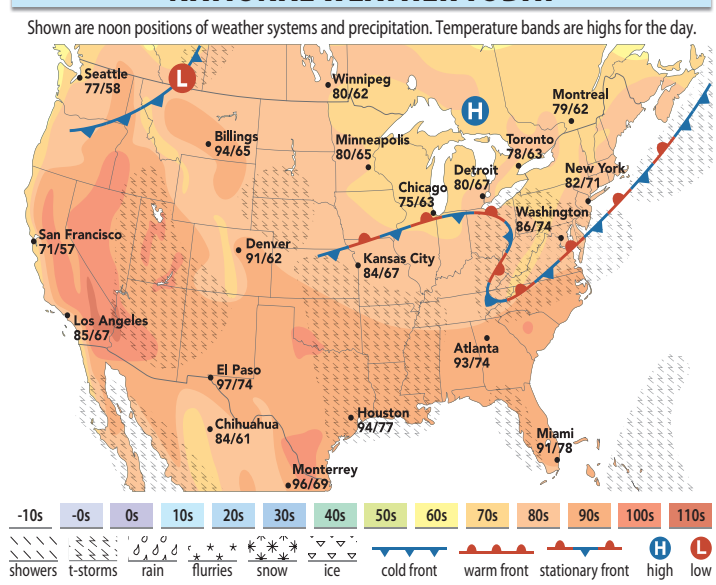

"I'm a big advocate of our neighbors knowing who we are," Smith said. "We try to do stuff every year as a neighborhood."

Smith said they try to keep neighbors connected by sharing email addresses and phone numbers. Erica Sandoval, Hermiston Police Department crime prevention/youth services officer, said this is exactly the type of things neighbors can do to help reduce crime.

National Night Out, Sandoval said, encourages people to get out and meet their neighbors. It also provides an opportunity for people to mingle with police and other first responders in a relaxed atmosphere.

Winning the party came at a perfect time, Smith said, as several new houses have been constructed in the neighborhood, as well as new neighbors moving into a couple of homes.

"This will be a good way to connect with the new neighbors," she said.

tape in the sign at the Eastern Oregon Higher Education Center.
