RAWLS: Graham also nearing return

Ravens in December. After gaining 44 yards on six carries on Seattle's opening possession, Rawls was engulfed by Brandon Williams and Chris Canty, who fell on him with his ankle caught underneath.

The injury ended a stellar rookie campaign that made Rawls the clear choice to replace a retiring Marshawn Lynch. He rushed for 830 vards and four touchdowns in 13 games with seven starts in place of an injured Lynch. His 209-yard effort against the San Francisco 49ers was the second-most rushing yards in a game in franchise history, trailing only Shaun Alexander's 266 yards in 2001.

"In the last couple days we've seen him really take off in burst and he's worked so hard. He's ready to be out there," head coach Pete Carroll said. "We still just have to work him into it and wean him, but it's really exciting to have him back."

Carroll and general manager John Schneider have repeatedly said Rawls and tight end Jimmy Graham are expected to be ready for the Sept. 11 season opener against the Miami Dolphins. Carroll said Tuesday that Graham

(knee) is close to being activated from the PUP list as well.

"Give us a couple of weeks. There's plenty of time here. We'll figure it out. I'm sure (Rawls) is going to be chomping at the bit come by the last preseason game, at least, if not sooner," Carroll said.

Rawls and three other running backs were unable to participate in Sunday's mock game. Christine Michael sat out due to illness. Third-round pick C.J. Prosise and seventhround pick Zac Brooks were sidelined with hamstring injuries.

Michael returned to practice Tuesday, and Prosise and Brooks are both expected back within the next week.

Despite his strong rookie campaign, Rawls isn't taking his early success for granted. He feels he has to win the job all over again.

'We're going to compete," Rawls said. "I don't feel established. I'm going to always be a hard worker. I'll always be a leader and I'm going to always congratulate guys whenever guys go out there and do some of the amazing things that they do."

College Football Ducks remain unsettled at QB

EUGENE — Oregon opened fall camp on Monday with six quarterbacks.

Five of them attended the team's media day. Three of them were mentioned by coaches and teammates as viable candidates for the starting job in 2016.

And two of them are getting the majority of the snaps.

The Ducks picked up where they left off at the spring game with Dakota Prukop competing with Terry Travis Jonsen, Wilson playing catch-up, and Jeff Lockie and Taylor Alie moonlighting as wide receivers.

"Dakota and Travis are taking a little more reps than Terry," offensive coordinator Matt Lubick said after the Ducks returned to the practice field. "The neat thing about fall camp is we've got a lot of time to let it play out. It's basically like having almost two spring balls. Then by the time we get into game preparation, we'll have a decision on who is going to be taking the majority of the reps."

There was a much better vibe among the quarterbacks compared to a year ago when Vernon Adams Jr. was absent from the start of camp while attending to academic requirements necessary to complete his transfer from Eastern Washington.

Prukop graduated from Montana State last December and has been establishing rapport with his new teammates and studying the Oregon playbook for more than seven months.

After passing for 3,025 yards and 28 touchdowns and rushing for 797 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2015, Prukop decided to transfer out of Big Sky country to play his senior year at Oregon, which won a late recruiting battle with Alabama for his services.

Prukop, who has added about 14 pounds of muscle to his 6-foot-2 frame since arriving, didn't expect to surge to the top of the depth chart as quickly as Adams did last August.

"It's not like I sat down and was like, 'Where's the competition going to be?' " said Prukop, who weighed in at 205 pounds to start camp. "It was more, which school do I like best, what's going to be the best fit, which offense do I like best. I'm confident in my own ability. I've been in two or three quarterback battles in my career, this is another one.

"The thing I'm excited about is that I kind of got to take the lead, in terms of setting the tone for the room. This is the best way we can get better, if we approach it like we're here to push each other."

Jonsen might have been Adams' backup last season had he not suffered a seasonending turf toe injury. The redshirt freshman believes his skill set as a 6-3, 194-pound dual-threat quarterback is a perfect fit in Oregon's offense.

Oregon coach Mark Helfrich said he wants the quarterback situation to sort itself out "organically" before naming a starter the week before the Sept. 3 opener against UC Davis.
