of $\$ 517,000$ - $\$ 100,000$ for the first-place finish and $\$ 417,000$ from the "side pot," the lawsuit alleged.
However, rodeo organizers soon learned of the scheme and stopped payment on the check,
the lawsuit said. RFD-TV Events now wants to recover other prize money earned by Cooper and Moore up to $\$ 100,000$ A telephone message left by
