The youngest of four children, Donald “Don” Allen Rhodes was born July 2, 1927, in Coulee City, Washington. He was the son to Louis and Edna Garton Rhodes. He attended local schools and was valedictorian of his class in 1945. Don graduated early to enlist in the United States Navy during World War II. He went to San Diego for boot camp, later to Gulf Port, Mississippi, for engineer school. He also went to Maer Island, California, San Francisco, Oakland and then to Vallejo when the U.S.S. Nereus was put into commission. They sailed to Japan to destroy the balance of the Japanese submarine fleet. After receiving his honorable discharge in Bremerton, Washington, he began his career as a funeral director, starting in Vancouver, Washington, at Limbers Funeral Home.

He moved to Walla Walla, Washington, and worked for Leonard DeWitt at DeWitt Funeral Home. After graduating from San Francisco College of Mortuary Science he returned to Walla Walla and worked there for 17 years. Don was active in the community and belonged to the Walla Walla Jaycees, past president of the Exchange Club, life member of and now the oldest past commander of the V.F.W. Post #992 and the Walla Walla Elks Club. He served as deputy coroner under Leonard DeWitt, who was the first elected coroner in Walla Walla County.

Don met his wife Arminta Hall on the slopes of Spout Springs and they were

married on September 7, 1952, in Walla Walla. In 1963, Don and Arminta moved to Milton-Freewater when they purchased the Munselle Company Funeral Home from John and Thelma Maxwell. Don was also active in the community. He was past president of the Milton-Freewater Rotary Club and attended for 44 years. He was a life member of the Milton Lodge #96 A.F. & A.M. where he served two times as worshipful master. He also belonged to Blue Mt. Shrine Club, Al Kader Temple Shrine and the American Legion Post #24. He served on the board of savings and loans for First Federal and later Western Heritage for many years and served as board chairman, appointed by Governor McCall, and served on the Oregon Cemetery and Mortuary Board and also served on the City Budget Committee. He also served on the Milton-Freewater Elementary School Board for several years.

In 1983 Don and Alan Ray purchased the Colonial-Dewitt Funeral Home. He later retired in 1985 after selling Munselle-Rhodes and then Colonial-DeWitt. He enjoyed working with wood and remodeling homes, which he did for his children. Don and Arminta made major renovations to their funeral home over the years and also to the three homes he lived in. Don and Arminta built their cabin in the Blue Mt. Campground, which they enjoyed for many years. Don was proud to be part of the greatest generation. His southern belle, Arminta, passed away March 27, 2016.

Dolores Atiyeh, wife of former governor, dies at 92

PORTLAND (AP) — Dolores Atiyeh, the wife of former Oregon Gov. Vic Atiyeh, has died at age 92.

Denny Miles, the governor’s long time spokesman, said Dolores Atiyeh died Monday at a care center in the Portland area. The Atiyehs had been married for 70 years when the ex-governor died in 2014.

As Oregon’s First Lady, Dolores Atiyeh was involved in numerous

charitable, historic and arts organizations, and was a leading force in the passage of a mandatory children’s immunization bill during the 1981 legislative session.

She also worked for the passage of a 1983 bill that required mandatory seat belt restraints for children 5 years old and younger.

Atiyeh is survived by two children and five grandchildren.
