An educational program providing a toolkit of skills to assist people with the caregiving process will be offered in Pendleton and Hermiston.

“Too often individuals in a caregiving situation find themselves depleted, anxious and even depressed,” said Helena Wolfe, Area Agency on Aging health promotion coordinator.

She said research shows that caregivers who take good care of themselves are better equipped to help their loved ones. Powerful Tools for Caregivers assists people that are involved in support and decision-making for a chronically ill or elderly loved one. The classes provide information for people whose loved one is near or far, living in their own home, the caregiver's home or even in a nursing home or assisted living facility. The sessions aren't designed for professional caregivers.

HOUGHTON, Mich. — Stanton Schmitz, a Pendleton High School student, was selected as one of 27 high school students from six states to attend the National Summer Transportation Institute at Michigan Technological University in Houghton, Michigan. He is the son of Philip and Stephanie Schmitz of Pendleton.

The highly competitive, two-week, scholarship-only residential program was part of Michigan Tech's Summer Youth Program and offered an opportunity for exceptional high school students to explore today's transportation industry. The students participated in discussions and hands-on design competitions and had the opportunity to spend time with industry role models from across the country and the world, in addition to spending time with other motivated students who shared their passion in a vibrant university setting.

One of the highlights was a tour of the Mackinac Bridge Authority and a “behind the scenes” look at the third longest suspension bridge in the country. The students traveled to Sault Ste. Marie and got a firsthand look at the largest waterway traffic system on earth — the Soo Locks shipping canal between Lake Superior and the lower Great Lakes.

Accepted students received a scholarship valued at more than \$1,800 that covered tuition, room and board and all supplies. NSTI scholarship funding was provided by a grant from the Federal Highway Administration.
