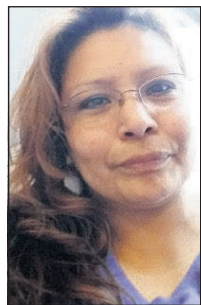
Victoria was kind, caring, generous and was never known to criticize anyone. She was known for her sense of humor, infectious laughter and she could bake the best banana bread. Victoria
